Dear Sir,

Thank you for your letter dated 8/8/71 and reception report.

This is to confirm your reception of G.B.S. transmissions on 3290 Khz on 8/8/71 between 0313 - 0402 GMT

The Guyana Broadcasting Service is an independent Guyanese organisation forming the nucleus of a national public service broadcast system for the future.

The service at present operates on 560 Khz with a maximum power output of 20 KW in the MW band. On 3290 or 5950 Khz in the H.F. band with vertical incidence aerial arrays having a gain of 3 dbs, and transmitter power output of 10 KW.

There is a VHF F.M. service for the Greater Georgetown area on a frequency of 102 mhz with a transmitter aerial combination giving an ERP of 100 watts to an omni directional aerial.

*The Service provide one programme in English which is carried by all transmitters. Programme hours are from 0500 to 0100 Guyana time.

*Our transmitters are located at Sparendam on the coast, six miles east of Georgetown.
