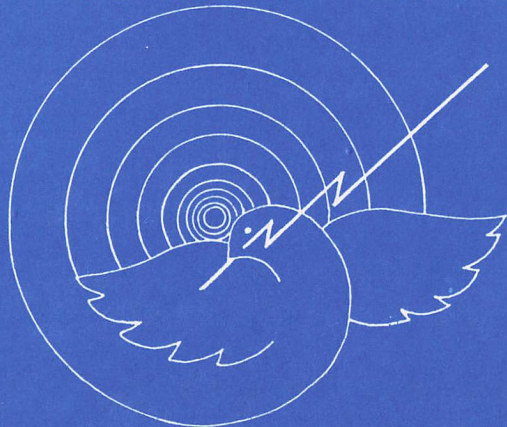

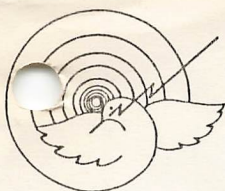

*language: English*


*The output power was 2 KW.*
