Radio Voice of the Gospel — ETLF — is a Christian broadcasting service supported by contributions from churches in various parts of the world. Programs are approximately 70% informational and 30% religious in character and are produced in local studios in the target areas of Africa, Asia and the Near and Middle East. Technical facilities include a 40 acre studio-administration and staff residence campus located 10 kilometers from the center of Addis Ababa. The two 100 kilowatt Brown Boveri shortwave transmitters are located 30 kilometers from the studios on a 300 acre site on which there is also erected a network of dual-band curtain antennas for external broadcasts and quadrant antennas for regional transmissions.
