Your letter and reception report dated 18th June, 1967 have been directed to this station for verification.

I am pleased to confirm that you were infact tuned to our new station at Benin Mid-Western Nigeria on 11th June, 1967 and at the time time and frequency quoted. Your loggings coincided with our station log books and schedule.

I know you will like to note that at the moment we operate two transmitters: A short and medium wave transmitters. The short wave transmitter is a British Marconi type BD268A of 10-KW power rating. It operates on 4.932 mc/s with a simple folded dipole aerial. The medium wave transmitter is an American Gates 5-KW transmitter type BC-5P and transmits on 470 mts.

For further details, I enclose herewith a pamphlet which I am sure will be of tremendous interest to you.
