Many thanks for your letter dated March 27, 1972, also for conveying by best wishes to my Uncle in Kenosha, gosh, I am quite sure he will be most surprised and very happy to hear from me, as I have neglected him somewhat in the past few months.

I also confirm that the radio station you heard on February 8, this year at 0400 to 0416 GMT on the 6155 kilocycles, was in fact Swazi Radio. I might add that we have had other letters from the United States, also advising that they have picked up our signal.

Unfortunately, I am not in a position to send you any photos of personnel at present, but this will be done in the form of negatives, when the photos have been taken during this week. I will send these on to you under separate cover when they have been processed.

I am also enclosing a cutting (Photostat copy) from a magazine "To the Point" which is obtainable, I should think, in the States, which gives you a pretty clear picture of what Radi Swazi is, what it consists of and also a little about the men at the top. I do hope that this will be sufficient for the article which you are hoping to publish.

All the reports we have has from America aII note a strong interference from the Austrian Radion Station. For your information, listed below are are broadcast frequencies.

6 a.m. to 7. p.m. - 49 Metre band 6155 Megacycles.
6 p.m. to Midnight - 90 Metre band 3223 Megacycles.
6 a.m. to 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. to Midnight - Mediumwave 1376 Kilocycles.

All the time listed above are local times, which is 2 hours ahead of GMT.
