We thank you for your letter dated 27th December, 1964 and are pleased to learn that you have been able to receive our transmission on 5026 kc/s in U.S.A.

We regret that lack of facilities make it difficult for us to check your reception in detail but there is every indication that your report does, in fact, refer to our daily Short Wave Transmissions on 5026 kc/s.

Long distance reports are always of interest to us and we look forward to hearing from you again.

Our Transmitter installation comprises 1 x 50 kW and 1 x .5 kW Medium Wave and 2 x 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ kW and 1 x 5 kW. Short Wave Transmitters. The Short Wave Transmitters each employ vertical incidence dipole arrays for local coverage. Our present Time/Frequency/Language Schedule is enclosed for your information and from this you will see that we broadcast in no less than eighteen languages.

Thank you for your good wishes which we are pleased to reciprocate.
