I am pleased to have your second one. As checked the programme details you inserted therewith they show you were correctly tuning in to our station. Bangkok Met. Radio staff is very pleased and feel be happy hearing that you and some of your friends could pick up our broadcast signals in a fine condition. It, of course, surprises us much that signals could be received by listeners this part of the world, normally they would be received only by countries situated in southern part, such as Australia, New Zealand or Malaysia which we had lots of letter of reception reports coming in to our station, this is due to transmitting antenna is beamed to south direction, that means intending for ships within areas of Malacca Strait, Andaman Sea, Gulf of Thailand and adjacent sea to be heard in order to pick up weather conditions and forecasts made by Thai Meteorological Department.
