Dear Mr. Dexter,

Many thanks for your letter dated 28th September and the reception report on the New Caribbean Relay Station, which was incidentally, the first report from the U.S.A. concerning Antigua to arrive on my desk. I am glad it was a good signal and have pleasure in confirming that the signal you heard on 6.195 MHz at 1100 GMT on 28th September did indeed come from Antigua.

It occurs to me that as you are obviously well equipped for reception you probably have available a tape recorder and in view of our understandable interest in the quality of the relay signal in the service area I wonder if you have time to make a five minute recording of the signal for our information. It would be most informative if you would use the widest IF bandwidth consistent with the interference situation and whatever aerial you have which gives the best reception.
