Dear Mr. Dexter:

Your letter of last January 20 addressed to Radio Citadelle has been handed to me by my son, Denis, who is the technician at the station. I have translated the letter for him but he is so busy that you will have to wait for a long time before receiving his answer. So I am answering for him. He is very, very pleased to learn you have heard Radio Citadelle at Lake Geneva. Right now he has a problem with the station antenna. Our State communication system which is called "TELECO" has an office and a high antenna very near Radio Citadelle. There is much interference when they talk at Teleco and Denis has suspended the use of the 49 meter until he changes the direction of the Radio antenna at the station.

I am a former teacher of French and Latin at Notre-Dame College in Cap-Haitien. I lost my wife last Sept. 28 and I have with me four sons and three daughters. Gabriel is the eldest. He just was 25 ~~years~~ ^{years} old March 18. Denis is the third son; he will be 22 next June. Our home is ^{at} less than one block from Radio Citadelle and Teleco. Our old city, Cap-Haitien, founded in 1670 by French settlers has not changed very much with its colonial buildings and its very narrow streets. Cap-Haitien was formerly called Cap-Français and has about 40,000 inhabitants. It is the second largest of the Republic of Haiti. Many American tourists visit Cap-Haitien each week. We have two

Cruise ships from Miami, Fla. every week. One on Monday and the second on Thursday. This letter will be mailed on board of the M/S. Bohème, one of the cruise ship. You probably will receive this letter next Tuesday 27. By mailing at the post office here it would take about ten to fifteen days for the letter to reach you. By the way I am enclosing one dollar bill, would you kindly buy for me 9 nine 11 ct stamps. Thank you in advance. I will be very pleased to render you any service if you want to receive something from Haiti.

Please excuse my broken English, I learned your language at school.
