I was very happy to receive your letter in date of April 8⁸ informing me that you have heard ~~XX~~ Radio-Independance in Wisconsin ~~xxx~~ ~~April 10, xxx~~ this month. It made a great pleasure to me to see that our programs are listened abroad very often for I have received many letters from Wisconsin.

In fact, it was really Radio-Independance that you have heard since you know that our broadcasting station is operated on the sixty meters band with a frequency of 5020 kilocycles. Radio-Independance operates three times a day:

Morning from 6 h 30 to 9 h 30 A.M.

Noon from 12 h 00 to 3 h 30 P.M.


Observed days & Sundays from 11 h 00 A.M. to 10 h 00 P.M.

All the programs, announcements and advertisings are diffused in French since you know that French is spoken here. Radio-Independance is a Model-52 Globe King. The broadcasting equipment consists of 19 tube communication transmitter. Its antenna, running from East to West, is measured 60 meters. We also used six tube preselector/preamplifier to the transmitter as an additional stage. Radio-Independance operates with a power of 500 watts at the antenna. Its call is 4VGS.

I am very glad indeed to know that you are fulfilling almost the same jobs with me in broadcasting... at stations WBKV, AM and FM in West Bend. For me, at Radio-Independance, 4VGS, in Gonaives I am not only Director of Programs but I am also employed like Speaker and writer. I am very [⊕] happy to make your acquaintance by letter and I hope that a day we will meet. I thank you for the letter and the identifications at the stations in West Bend that you sent to me. I beg you to present my best wishes to the entire staff of the WBKV, AM & FM. I also wish that you shall be able to hear Radio-Independance with better reception. I hope that my letter will be of good use to you and that it will verify your report. I am trying to hear your stations. You'll have my report.
