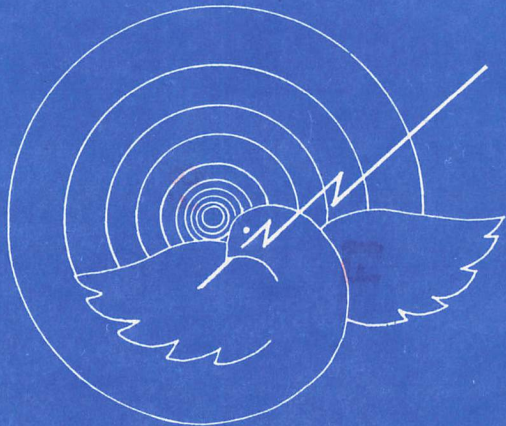
Your reception report of Radio for Peace International was forwarded to the staff operating the station in Costa Rica. We realize that a QSL card was sent, however would like to state that the broadcast you heard was the inaugural broadcast. In addition, that evening, 17 September UTC, we were only running 40 watts of power. We are operating on an experimental basis at this time and are still working the "bugs" out of the system. We have moved to 7.375 MHz from 0100-0400 UTC and are also on 13 meters at 21.555 MHz from 1900 to 2200 UTC with the same programming. We have been running only 40 watts again recently, but hope to be back up to 2 KW in a few days and look forward to a substantial power upgrade hopefully in the not too distant future.

Again, thank you for your report and please let us know if we can be of further help in preparation of the article for Popular Communications.

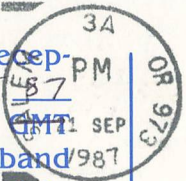
