Dear Sir;

We are very glad to let you know that, though late, we are in receipt of your letter dated 13 March, 1983. We confirm, what you received on 9 March 1983 on 9.950 MHZ and on the other frequencies mentioned in your letter was our Tigrinya morning broadcast.

Thanking you very much for your interest and the burden you took to inform us of the reception of our station, We take great pleasure to bring to your notice that Voice of the Broad Masses of Eritrea is transmitted on the following five short wave frequencies ; i.e. 14.340 MHZ, 9.950 MHZ, 7.450 MHZ, 3.760 MHZ and 6.250 MHZ .

Hours of daily transmissions are as indicated below.

Tigrinya programme daily at	7-7.30hrs.	18-18.30 hrs.	21-21.30 hrs
Tigre " " "	7.30-8.00	18.30-19.00	21.30-22.00 hrs
Afaar on Mon., Wedn., Fr.& Sat.	8.00-8.30	19.00-19.30	22.00-22.30 "
Amharic on Sund., Tues., &Thr.	8.00-8.30	19.00-19.30	22.00-22.30 "
Arabic daily at	8.30-9.00	17.30-18.00	22.30-23.00 "

(Hours are stated in local time and there is a difference of three hours between our local time and GMT.)

Our transmission may slightly vary around the above indicated frequencies. The variation has been made necessary to evade enemy jamming efforts, which have been going on since the begining of last year.

I have in hand your letter of August 14, 1983 for which very many thanks. Please my apologies for the long delay in responding to your letter owing to my travel to Eritrea in July and the whole of August.

We had forwarded your letter of March 16 to the Information Department of the Eritrean People's Liberation Front in Eritrea and I personally talked to the authorities concerned about your reception when I was there in July/August. I am more than happy now to enclose the attached reply confirming your reception.

We are all, in deed, pleased, Mr. Dexter, to know about this and we are wondering if you could record the daily Tigrinya (the first item in the list) broadcasts for us. We will be committed to cover cost of cassettes for the recordings, postage and other incidentals. We are curious to know the cost of your equipment too.

The Eritrean Relief Committee, Inc. (ERC) is a non-profit humanitarian organization coordinated by a committee of Americans and Eritreans (I am enclosing some materials for your information). Its purpose is to solicit funds and materials to help the victims of war and drought in Eritrea. We do not, therefore, directly deal with the above subject and I would like to ask you to direct your communication to:
