Dear Mr. Dexter ,

Let me first apologize for the substantial delay in the answer to your kind letter of September 22nd, 1969. I was at home with some sort of autumn cold lately, and then I also had a belated brief holiday.

I have checked your reports from May this year and have found them quite correct. As you have probably noted, we do not indicate the exact location of Radio Prague transmitters on our QSL cards. This requirement would complicate the adopted verification procedure which is handled by the respective language sections. Our small department checks some of the data in the incoming reception reports.

As an exception to this rule, however, we have indicated the locations of our transmitters on the two enclosed duplicate QSL cards which will verify your two reception reports of May this year.
