I am also returning, with thanks, your FPC's which I am unable to use.

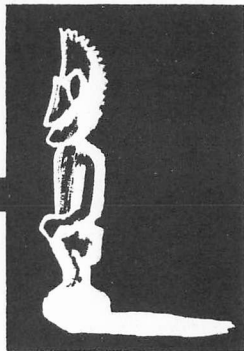
Congratulations on your reception and particularly on your perseverance over the years!
