Dear Mr. Dexter,

It is with great pleasure I confirm your reception of Radio Indiana on 6990 and 4004 kHz in the 40 and 80 meter free international broadcast bands at 0445 and 0500 GMT respectively on April 27, 1980.

R. Indiana broadcasts one GMT Sunday per month in either the 40 or 80 meter bands at 0500 GMT s/on. Occasional tests are made GMT Saturdays at the same time and at 2100 GMT on 21600a kHz in 13 meter band. Other tests are announced via FrenDx and RCI Dx Digest and FRC-U.S.A.

R. Indiana will conduct a unique DX experiment on July 4, North American Date beginning at midnight Eastwrn DST. We will be on the top 5 minutes of every hour on the hour for the 24 hour period on this frequency schedule:

GMT

0400-1200 7360 or 6990 kHz
1200-1400 13990 kHz
1400-2300 21600 kHz
2300-0400 7360 or 6990 kHz

alternate NAM darkness: 4004
alternate NAM daylight: 21600

We would appreciate it if you could pass this information along to FRENIDX and Glenn Hauser for a DX Digest report.
