Dear Gerry,

I was indeed surprised and yet sad to receive your letter of July 10, 1988. Sad? Because it seems the VOL has had a terrible mail problem that we not aware of until the past year. It seems your mail was lost at our ex-maildrop address. I received your report for our transmission on 2/3/85 and sent you our classic "Gagged Broadcaster" card #175. (This was upon receipt of your followup.) I never received your original report. It's evident that our former mail-drop was interfering with your getting a response. I am very very sorry that this took place but I'm afraid that was out of my hands. This time you can be assured of a reply. You are the only VOL listener as far as I know who has ever had to send a followup in order to get our confirmation of reception. (Mr. Zeller told me he suggested that you read Dexter's QSL book!) George is one of our longest running friends. It seemed like every time we hit the air, George was right there..uncanny as hell it was.

I have enclosed 2 QSL cards for each of your VOL receptions. I'm sorry that we are all out of the Gagged Broadcaster card. I would like to see it revived some day. By the way, our transmission on Feb. 3, 1985 was powered with a whapping 45 watts output into a dipole antenna. In Dec. of 1987, you heard us with an output power of 40 watts into the same antenna.

I'm wondering if you could do us all a favour? I understand you know Don Jensen, would you please tell him we never received his reply to my letter that I sent with his QSL (#183-Gagged Broadcaster cd). Scott told me that he had his letter there and would forward it to us but he never did. Maybe if he would care to write again, he could send it through George, provided Mr. Zeller doesn't mind. I doubt he would.

The VOL began broadcasting on Nov. 14, 1983 on 7415 kHz. We also used the 19 metre band many times, most usually on or about 15,050 kHz. We were often heard in HI while utilizing this band. Tests to Europe and Australia were not successful.

Genghis and I (being the executive board of VOL) have discussed the possibility of going back on shortwave again. We decided that we not go back on until we have a new show taped. We've done many "classic" programs but enough is enough, time to prove we still have what it takes.....maybe. We've not recorded any shows since 1986. Future programs from VOL should be much better audio quality (on the tape) due to greatly improved studio equipment. I plan on making cassettes available to a selected few. If you would care to listen to any of our "old" shows on tape, tell George and he can relay the message. I'll make an exception this time and send you a 180 minute tape of some of our best stuff. Just say the word and it's yours. Oh, the expense is on VOL. I feel this is the least I can do given all the problems with getting a QSL to you.

Again, I'm very sorry for the delay in getting your reception/s verified. Please write us again, anytime. Hopefully until next time, best wishes to you and good luck in your radioing hobby.

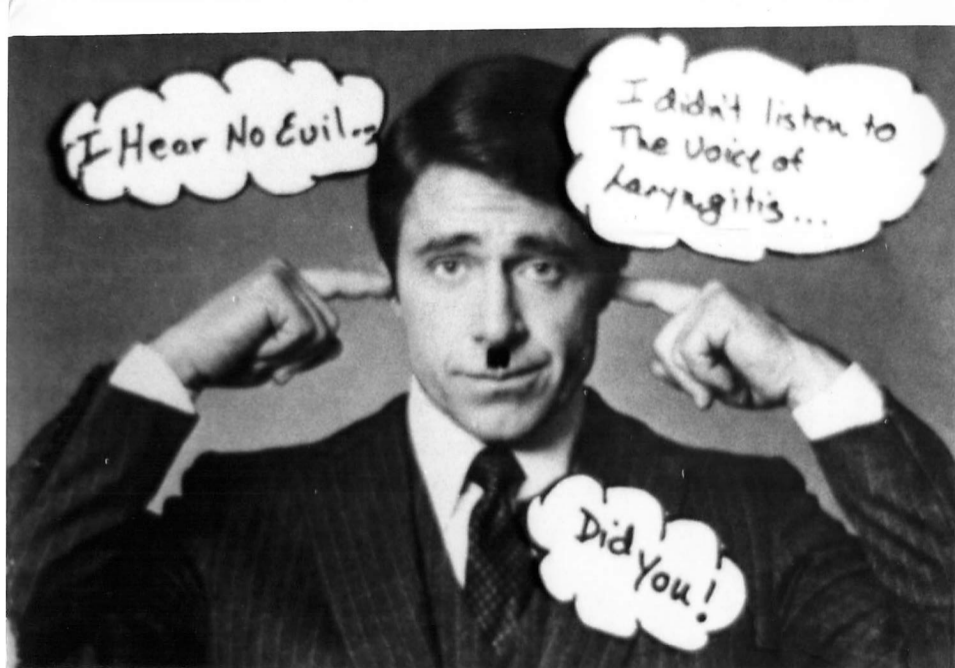

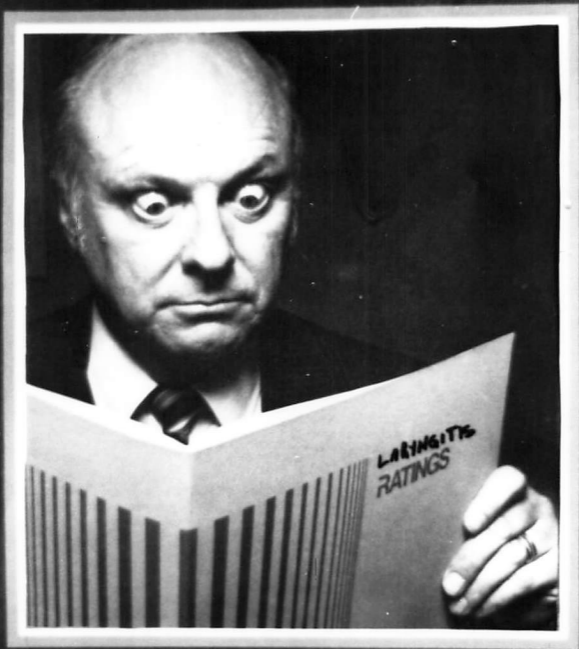
Dear Gerry Dexter:
