Thank you for your letter and reception report of 0009 UT on July 10, 1983. We were transmitting test signals to Europe and the Far East on 11940 KHz at that time. You received our signals from the "backside" of our 20 db gain directional antenna. Transmitter output to the antenna was 100 KW.

Our opening broadcasts scheduled for July 18, 1983 have been postponed. We were tardy in getting our test data to the FCC. We will go on-the-air in accordance with the enclosed schedule as soon as we receive authorization from the FCC.
