Dear Mr. Dexter,

This is to thank you for your reception report dated July the 24th. 1959 concerning our programme. All details are correct. We hope you will keep listening in to our programmes and send us a report from time to time. It shall be greatly appreciated.

Radio Tashkent broadcasts programmes in English twice daily on two wave-lengths --- in the 25.66 metre band on a frequency of 11,690 kilocycles and in the 42.25 metre band on a frequency of 7,100 kilocycles from twelve-thirty to thirteen hours and from sixteen-thirty to seventeen hours, Greenwich Mean Time.

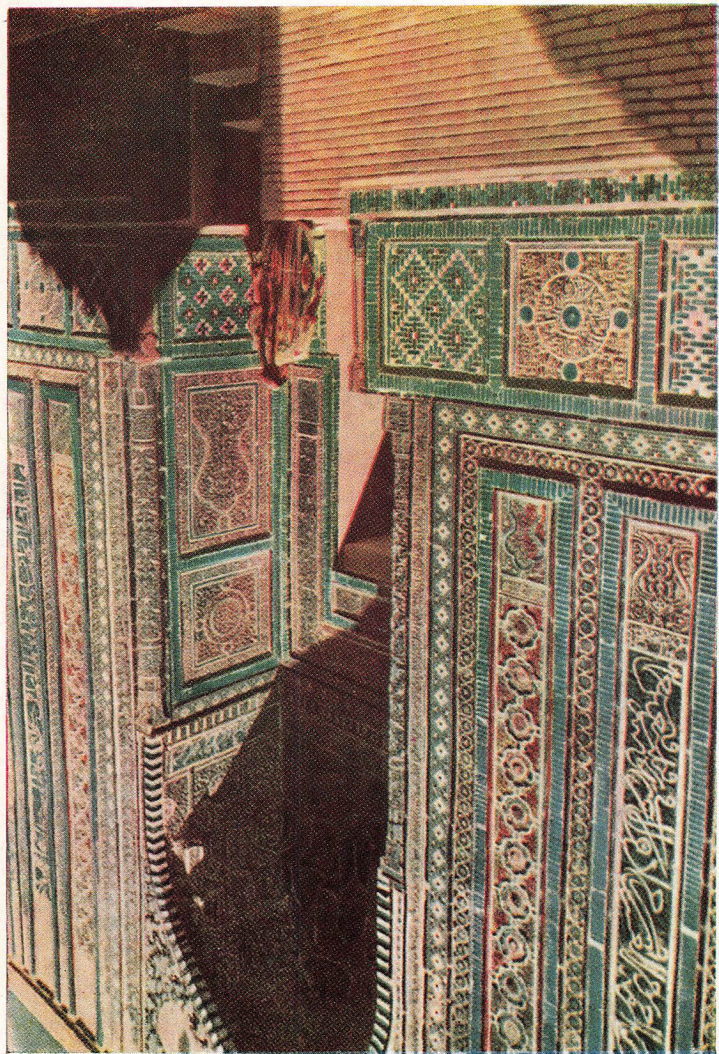
We broadcast a good deal of information about the life of the Usbek people as well as of the other peoples inhabiting Soviet Central Asian Republics and Soviet Kazakhstan, about important international events and about the Peace-loving Policy of the Soviet Government.

Our programmes very often include recorded accounts from factories and plants, schools and higher educational establishments, clubs and stadiums which show the ordinary people of the country at work and at play. For philatelists, we now have a special programme called "Five Minutes for Stamp Collectors" on every second Wednesday during our first broadcast at twelve-thirty hours, Greenwich Mean Time. In these broadcasts we give a good deal of information about the latest postage stamps issued here in the Soviet Union and about the activities of stamp collectors in our parts. Besides the music we broadcast every day we give special concert programmes on Sundays, Thursdays and Fridays during our second transmission at sixteen-thirty hours, Greenwich Mean Time. Every Saturday we broadcast our Mail Bag Programme during our first and second transmissions. Among our monthly features we have a "Radio Magazine "Soviet Uzbekistan" and a "Radio Journal for Music Lovers".

Well, Mr. Dexter, should you have any requests or suggestions concerning our programmes, do not hesitate and write us. We shall be glad to answer your letters. Best regards from Radio Tashkent and hoping to hear from you again soon, I am






Dear Mr. Gerry L. Dexter,
