POPULAR ELECTRONICS MAGAZINE TO BE REDESIGNED

The following information is direct from Oliver P. Ferrell, Editor of Popular Electronics magazine. He is a NASWA member. "Starting with the September 1970 issue of Popular Electronics, the entire magazine will be redesigned. The SWL column will not appear, nor the English Language program skeds. Too, the Ham Radio column is being dropped; The CB column has already been discontinued. Also, the WPE registration program, although probably to continue after certain details are finalized, will be under a different prefix and sponsor. The reasons for these and other particular changes mentioned are complex on one hand, but very simple when examined in the light of the type of reader that represents most of the PE audience numbering 380,000.

Over a period of years there are less than 5000 seriously interested SWL's regularly following the SWL column. Readership of the ARO column was less and the CB column was about 20,000. Taken together, this represents only about 8% of the PE audience. Editorial pages devoted to this 8% however, was never less than 20% of the entire magazine. If only on the basis of business economics, that 20% of monthly editorial space should be devoted to other subject areas that might increase circulation by an equal amount.

The changes mentioned were inevitable and unfortunately have been speeded up by the lack of cohesion among SWL's, including the comings and goings of clubs, officers, falsified elections, petty bickering, etc. The past two years have not convinced me that SWLing is a healthy growing hobby."

Realizing that approximately 90% of NASWA members are readers/subscribers to PE, we would be very interested to know opinions and reactions regarding the "redesigned" Popular Electronics. Do you intend to renew your subscription when it expires or will you now look to another commercial source for like info/data such as appeared in past PE? No matter, one thing is sure; Mr. Ferrell and PE are due a BIG thanks for the boost given the SWLing hobby during the past several years.

We cannot help but wonder if this action by PE will "influence" other magazines!

NOTES ON RADIO NORDSEE INTERNATIONAL

With the advent of Radio Nordsee International, the first of the major "pirates" in recent years to operate on the short wave bands, a new field of SWBC DXing has opened up. At the time of this writing, the station has been off its SW frequency for over a month; however, this is reported to be temporary only. At any rate, for the few short weeks that it did occupy 6210 khz, it provided a worldwide DX target first from its position off the coast of Holland, and subsequently from its position in late March off the Essex coast, England.

At the time of writing, RNI has yet to verify one reception report, but perhaps there is a reason. Mr. Edwin Bollier, the owner of RNI, says that he keeps the "fanmail" packed like banknotes in a set of cardboard boxes at his office on the Albiesriederstrasse in Zurich (the station's headquarters - in a country which never signed the 1965 international agreement against offshore broadcasting.) There are, says his staff, some 10,000 letters from Britain, 7,000 from Germany, a few thousand from Holland, Belgium, and so on. Most of them are from the "young Europeans" for whom the station's programs are intended.

Mr. Bollier, 32, has a reputation for being a good radio engineer and a tough businessman. He started his company, MEBO LTD., some 10 years ago. Now it has registered offices in Zurich, Portugal, and Sierra Leone. He drives a large Mercedes (in the toned-down King's Road style favored by successful young entrepreneurs) and lives with his wife in an apartment in the same block that contains his Zurich offices.

Reportedly, RNI cost him over 400,000 Pound Sterling (over U.S. \$ 8,200,000) to set up, some of the capital probably being derived from a deal he made with CARITAS, the Roman Catholic relief operation in Biafra, which bought a large amount of American and Japanese radio equipment from him in August 1968 to set up a radio network in Biafra.

For years, wireless had always been his great passion. With his partner, Mr. Erwin Meister, he set up their first radio station in 1956 when at school. Later, in 1968, they got the idea to go into the pirate radio business ("we prefer to call it 'free radio'") when they were asked to re-equip the old Radio London ship, 'Galaxy', which was then lying in a Hamburg dock. Before the deal was completed however, West Germany signed the 1965 agreement, and rather than sell the equipment, Bollier and Meister decided to launch their own station.

The 650-ton freighter 'Silvaplane' was acquired and renamed 'Mebo II'. They then installed a 105 kw. transmitter, broadcasting on medium wave, SWBC, and VHF (FM) through a 140 foot aerial tower. On board the 'Mebo II' there are two sound studios, four resident disc jockeys, two engineers, a cook, steward and six seamen, all with their own cabins.

Before Mebo II began transmitting from its original position off the Dutch coast in January, the station received (in response to requests) over 400 tapes from people wanting to become disc jockeys. Five were selected. Four have English names

(although they insist that this doesn't necessarily mean that they have British passports) and the fifth is a young German who broadcasts under the code name "Hannibal"

Mr. Urs Emmenegger, the station's managing director states that RNI will also be used for altruistic purposes, apart from its commercial aims. This has already included campaigning for the United Nation's Children's Fund, and as soon as texts are ready, it will start campaigns for the World Wildlife Fund.

The one major difficulty which RNI has come up against since its move to the Essex coast on March 24 has been the choice of its MW frequency, nominally 1605 khz (although logged in North America on 1610 khz). The strong signal of RNI on this frequency caused such interference to the British Trinity House's East Coast radiotelephone (marine) link on a closely adjacent frequency that the British Ministry of Posts and Telecommunications authorized and ordered the power of the marine transmitter increased 5-fold, thereby causing RNI to close down within hours.

Since that time, RNI has resumed transmissions on MW channels in various segments of the broadcast band, but each time, they have found themselves jammed by a new mobile jamming station operated by the British Post Office.

What of the future? No one yet knows, but in a recent statement by Mr. Bollier following an RNI shutdown to again change its MW frequency, he stated:

"If the interference follows us we shall reply by jamming the B.B.C. We have three transmitters in our ship and one could easily be modified to transmit into an English program. We do not believe that our present transmissions are interfering with anyone."

Anyone want to guess which transmitter would be converted as a jammer??

TWR

On February 5, 1970, the Netherlands Antillian Postal Service issued two new stamps to commemorate the fifth anniversary of Trans World Radio in Bonaire. The ten-cent stamp gives a view of TWR's studio and office complex in Bonaire, while the fifteen-cent stamp is the artist's conception of TWR's symbol of the Cross and radio waves. Issued in sheets of 50 (5 x 10), they will be available while supplies last up to February 4, 1972. Orders may be placed with a local stamp dealer or directly with: Postmaster, Willemstad, Curacao, Netherlands Antilles. In the latter case, payment may be accomplished by sending two IRCs for a set of the stamps.G Galkin...G Dexter

RAUL FONTAINA
URUGUAY'S PROGRESSIVE BROADCASTER

On December 17, 1939 -- early in World War II and after Hitler's panzers had crushed Poland -- a beleaguered Britain's morale received an inspiring boost from a bloody, dramatic sea battle that ended in the harbor of Montevideo, Uruguay. The story was described for a listening Allied world by newsmen on Raul Fontaina's Radio Carve in Montevideo. The ignominious but violent end of the German pocket battleship Graf Spee, blown up by her crew three days after a running battle with the British cruisers Ajax, Achilles, and Exeter, was within sight of a shore lined with more than 300,000 persons. Radio Carve reporters not only described the final act, but were credited as first to report that there had been a battle and that the German quarry would be scuttled, despite strong denials by German sources and Montevideo newspapers.

One of the more sensational of Radio Carve's performances, the Graf Spee's death only added to a long string of news firsts for Raul Fontaina.

Senor Fontaina is owner of Radio Carve (CX16, CX13), La Voz del Aire (CX24), and Sociedad Anonima de Emisoras de Television y Anexos (SAETA-TV) channel 10, all in Montevideo.

Raul Fontaina has an impressive history of news beats in a long career on the air. He has been and still is a vigorous fighter for freedom. Often the struggle has been at great personal risk. It was the constant irritant of Fontaina's Radio Carve criticizing Argentina's dictator Juan Peron that brought a threat the transmitter would be bombed. Only the hasty flight of the dictator may have saved the transmitter. The pilot of the plane simply ignored the orders and skipped the target.

Tall, handsome, distinguished, and bounding with kinetic energy, Senor Fontaina moves about his studios with a sprightliness that belies his age. He is part of the operation and plunges in to do the things that he sees need doing -- whether pounding a nail in the wall to hang a picture or finishing a script at deadline. He is famous for a wit that was honed in college days when several fellow students and he founded the comic theater group, Troupe Ateniense. The group became very popular in Montevideo. It gave annual shows satirizing political and social events of the time.

But Raul Fontaina is best known among broadcasters knowledgeable about Latin American broadcasting for his unrelenting fight in the interest of freedom.

Arch Madsen, president of the Bonneville station group based in Salt Lake City, and chairman of the National Association of Broadcasters ad hoc international relations study committee, says: "How Raul Fontaina put his life and property in jeopardy to help bring Peron's downfall is truly one of the great stories of broadcasting's power in mankind's battle for freedom."

Frequently during his broadcast career, Senor Fontaina has faced difficult political pressures because of his defense of liberty. His stations have been put off the air at times for brief periods. "Misfortunes" he calls the incidents, that only encouraged his firm belief in freedom. During World War II he consistently promoted the Allied cause. During these years his prestige increased and gave credence to his 12 year fight against dictator Peron. It has been said that Radio Carve, its 50 kw power covering all of Uruguay and much of Argentina, was one of the most important factors in the downfall of the Peron regime.

Senor Fontaina is a newsman's newsman. He believes that every report must be credulous and accurate.

Raul Fontaina, as many other newsmen of the past years, began his career in journalism as a sports writer then as a radio sports reporter. He began his sports writing as a sideline with El Pais and El Diario and then Imparcial, all in Montevideo. Imparcial sent him to Paris to cover the 1924 Olympic games. His first broadcasting was of sports events. In 1930, he left Imparcial to join a local station. He gave humorous treatment to sports reporting. He was later joined by his brother Roberto and by his

present business partner, Juan E. De Feo.

In 1932 Messrs. Fontaina and De Feo rented Radio Carve, which Mr. Fontaina now owns. Mr. Fontaina has been programming news since 1931. His credo: "...to assist the people at any sacrifice, offering broadcasting as the modern communications medium."

Radio Carve concentrated on news and Mr. Fontaina founded another station to cover sports. The second station was La Voz del Aire.

The new station and Radio Carve were incorporated in 1941 as Sadrep Ltda. with Raul Fontaina as president and general director and Mr. De Feo as technical director.

On December 7, 1956, Mr. Fontaina established Uruguay's first television station, SAETA-TV on channel 10.

Mr. Fontaina is well-known abroad because of his participation in international broadcasting conferences. He founded the National Association of Uruguayan Broadcasters and was its vice president and then President, and is a leader in the Inter-American Broadcasting Association.

The U.S. National Association of Broadcasters, in March 1969, presented its first international broadcasting award to Senor Fontaina in ceremonies at its convention in Washington.

At that ceremony NAB President Vicent T. Wasilewski said the award was "recognition to Raul Fontaina for his years of devoted service to the preservation of free broadcasting in Latin America, for his contribution as a pioneer in the development of radio and television in his country."

Mr. Fontaina has continued his involvement in public affairs. His latest concern is with bringing stability to Uruguay's inflation-ridden economy. Twenty of his proposals for placing the economy on an even keel were adopted last year by the present Colorado party government of his close friend, President Jorge Pacheco Areco.

RADIO MALAYSIA

September 16th 1963 - the first time that radio listeners heard "Ini-lah Radio Malaysia" on the air. Up to that date they had been only hearing Radio Malaya, Radio Sabah, and Radio Sarawak. The birth of Malaysia was also the birth of a new era in the history of broadcasting in the south Asian region. Just as people of these territories had come together so had the broadcasting stations. In the case of the radio stations, this had in a sense only meant a formalization of relations that had begun to exist about two years earlier when the representatives of Sabah, Sarawak, and Singapore had taken up enthusiastically the idea of coming together of these territories that the Tunku had suggested in May 1961. Once the idea was taken up and the Malaysia Solidarity Committee had been formed, the broadcasting organizations of these territories swung into action selling Malaysia through feature programs, commentaries, talks, answers to listeners queries and forums.

Then came Confrontation and Radio Malaysia was once more in the forefront of the nation's fight to preserve national sovereignty. Through Suara Malaysia, the Home Service and special programs done for overseas stations, Malaysia answered propaganda put out against the country. Officers from Radio Malaysia - Kuala Lumpur went to Sabah and Sarawak and together with their colleagues in the radio organizations and in the Information Services countered the efforts of the Sukarno regime. The success of their efforts can be gauged from the fact that so few Malaysians were misled.

When Singapore left the Malaysian federation, Radio Singapura left the Radio Malaysia network.

Although Confrontation was a hard time for Radio Malaysia, stretching resources and the staff, it was also a time of exacting growth. New regional stations were opened in Malacca, Penang, Johore Bahru, and Ipoh...the transmitters were strengthened and work was begun on the Broadcasting Complex - the new home of the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting. On the programming side, more and more programs were produced on a local basis. Through talentime competitions, song writing contests and so on, new talents were discovered and utilized.

The end of the Confrontation and the resumption of friendly relations with Indonesia has brought a new page in Radio Malaysia's history - though it has not meant a relaxation in efforts at development. Radio Malaysia is looking forward to further years of progress.

Its policy has been and will be to try to give listeners what they would like to hear, not forgetting, of course, the three cardinal principles of broadcasting - to inform, educate, and entertain. Through ceaseless training and constant self-criticism and sheer hard work, Radio Malaysia plans to increase and improve services to listeners. The station holds that one of its most important tasks is to search and develop the talent in music, drama, and the written word that there is in Malaysia.

Finally, the role of building up the unity and solidarity of the Federation is always foremost and every endeavor will be made to carry out this role - by breaking down the racial barriers through programs which tell Malaysians the customs and traditions of the different races, by introducing the music and cultural heritage of the different races, and through the encouragement of the efforts of other Malaysians to help build a truly Malaysian culture and strengthen Malaysian solidarity.

COMMONWEALTH BROADCASTING
PARLEY IN JAMAICA

A Commonwealth broadcasting conference is scheduled to take place in Jamaica from the first of June to the sixteenth of June this year. This conference is the eighth since the first was held some 25 years ago.

Over 80 delegates will be attending from various broadcasting systems in the Commonwealth countries, systems which help to mould the minds of over a third of the world's population.

The Conference will consist of professional broadcasters comprised of directors, general managers, engineers, and departmental heads in these stations.

The conference will be chaired by Mr. Wycliffe Bennett, general manager of the Jamaica Broadcasting Corporation (JBC). This will be the first time that a national corporation (JBC) of a country as small as Jamaica will be host.

Incidentally, this is the second international conference on broadcasting to be held in Jamaica in the past six months. In November of last year, the JBC organized and hosted a conference of heads of public service broadcasting systems in the Commonwealth Caribbean.

VR is attempting to find a clear channel in the 19 meter band since 15285 is QRM'd by Moscow. At the time of this writing, they have tested 15165 (per my request) and 15155. The former is a superb signal in the northern part of the USA while 15155 suffers considerable interference. Watch NEWSROOM and LOG REPORT for complete details. Higher propagation conditions are permitting the emission on 17750 at the same time...the first time in several years that a 16 meter channel has been used for a North American beam. WAM

Reports have to be 3 (three) each over the four BBC main SW outlets: Great Britain sites (Daventry, Skelton, etc.); Atlantic relay (Ascension Island), East Mediterranean relay (Limassol, Cyprus), and Far Eastern relay (Tebrau, Malaysia). This will make a total of twelve reports. Each report must contain location (Tebrau, London, Limassol, or Ascension), date, time, frequency and a few words about programme content (program details). A certificate from the World Radio Club will be sent if all requirements are met (and reports correct) which will also include four "verifications required by the serious DX'er." (Presumably this means actual verification/QSL's will be issued instead of the usual BBC acknowledgement cards). This in itself is something of an award.
