DIVERSITY DX RECEPTION

by Edward C. Shaw

Big time DX can frequently be detected with two receivers which would otherwise be inaudible or useless on a single more sophisticated receiver. At present, this writer is employing a diversity reception method using SX-190 and SP-600 receivers. The technique calls for listening to both receivers at one time through the use of split headphones (stereo). Each receiver, using its own antenna is tuned to the same frequency. By channeling one receiver to the left ear and the other receiver to the right ear, a superior sensitivity and signal quality is realized surpassing that available from either receiver used alone.

The greatest advantage I have found for diversity reception, however, is the ability to locate new, or to confirm reported parallel broadcasts of different frequencies. Recently, I was thrilled with the affirmation of Jordan on the reported frequency of 11,810 kHz at 5 KW - a parallel to its 7155 kHz outlet. The 11,810 kHz outlet was not audible on either of my receivers used separately. But, by tuning the SX-190 to 7155 kHz for the left ear, and tuning the SP-600 to 11,810 kHz for the right ear, I detected the tell-tale resonant echo on 11,810 kHz which can only occur if both ears are hearing the same thing.

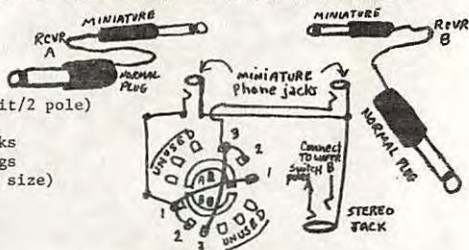
To accomplish this easy method all one need do is use two sets of headphones, one for each receiver; each ear listening to its own earphone. It may be a bit uncomfortable as well as appear ludicrous to wear two sets of phones, however, and to avoid this as well as to make it conveniently easy to switch from receiver to receiver, the writer devised a small black box for installation between receivers which will enable listening to a choice of:

- (1) Signal A with both ears
- (2) Signal A into left ear; and signal B into right ear
- (3) Signal B into both ears

The total cost of new parts at Radio Shack came to less than \$8.00, and that was enough to construct two units with parts left over. You can't buy just one of most items - they come in packages of two or three. Otherwise, all else that is needed is a cheap stereo headset. I dislike regular stereo phones though, since they reproduce frequency extremes. So, one can be constructed from two single earphones bought extra and spliced together properly in a stereo phone plug.

Parts List:

- 1- plastic mini-box
- 1- wafer switch (6 posit/2 pole)
- 1- stereo jack
- 2- miniature phone jacks
- 2- miniature phone plugs
- 2- phone plugs (normal size)

THE WAY I SEE IT

DXing had its beginning in the early days of radio, and from what I can glean from old hobby or club magazines and talking to old timers, it must have been fun. At least that phase of the hobby has not changed.

In my opinion, however, I believe that the modern DXer is an entirely different bird than his predecessor. For instance, one must keep in mind that there were far fewer stations, say forty years ago. And, while they were operated with peanut power by today's standards, I'm convinced that DXing was easier then than it is now. (I anticipate flack over that one).

Today's crowded band situation and super-gigawattage has driven all but a couple dozen of the most hardy nations off the international bands. This is exaggerating a bit, but the truth is that nobody has room to elbow their way in, and even if another station could be flattened and edged in sideways it couldn't be heard with any consistent quality beneath the thunderous reverberations of a band crackling with literally millions of watts. Even to pull a sneak and try edging over the legitimate ends of the band doesn't work - particularly in the U.S.A. - because of the multitudes of tweedeling and buzzing utilities or quacking side band transmissions. Ironically, it is because of the noise and crowded bands that most utilities and amateurs fled to side band operations in the first place - only causing grief to those remaining behind.

But, getting back to my point - today's DXer not only may pride himself on even discovering a powerhouse among the powerhouses, he could down right slap himself on the back and beam for a month if he should pull in a five kilowatt anywhere outside the U.S.A. Old timers that reminisce the days of 200 watters or 500 watters out in the Pacific aren't fooling anyone. With the ionosphere empty of all the RF garbage thrown up there today, the noise level would be flat on the floor. No wonder that a DXer could then hear those small stations faraway which were spaced every 500 kHz instead of 5 or less! Any S-meter deflection at all was probably a catch of some sort.

So, don't pine for the good old days. Take some pride in what is going on today. I wonder just what kind of luck a DXer from the 30's would have if suddenly snatched into our present situation? Yes, I'll agree the fun is still there. But, patience, planning, try-it-again is needed today. Once a new country is logged today, you can rest assured it was "the hard way!"

ON TO THE TOP: (Last)

How Can I QSL Those Rare DX Stations?

EDITOR'S NOTE: This is the last in a series of articles exploring serious SWBC DXing. It is aimed at the listener with some DXing experience who is ready to progress into areas not usually treated in beginner manuals.

The major stations you've already verified often seek listeners' reports knowing something of the DXers' special language and going out of their way to please. Rare DX stations, by their very nature, don't get many reports. They usually aren't trying to reach North American audiences. Their staffs often don't know what a QSL is, much less why a listener is so interested in receiving a confirming letter or card. These stations, in short, are much harder to verify.

It is assumed you know the basic report writing technique. You include the necessary bits, the frequency, time, date, program and reception detail and the request for verification. When dealing with the rarer stations, it is more important to write in the language of the station unless you have reason to believe that someone at the station knows English. If you include mint stamps or IRCs with your reports only on rare occasions, plan to do so regularly when writing the lesser-heard stations.

It is important to get your report into the hands of someone who is known to reply, so keep track of verie signers, the names of persons who sign other DXers' reports.

Often your first report won't bring a response. Use periodic follow-ups, or new reports to non-repliers. It can take a year, five years, ten years to get a verification from some rare stations. Persistence is necessary.

But beyond this, what? The serious, experienced DXer who is interested in QSLs develops additional reporting techniques, tricks or ploys, if you will, to get verifications from the rare, really hard-to-QSL stations. Not infrequently DXers guard these secret methods jealously. These little extra techniques are, to a degree, perishable commodities. Their usefulness may decrease with usage, so, understandably, veteran DXers tend to keep quiet about their best ploys. Eventually, you, too, will develop your own series of reporting tricks that work for you.

In essence, though, what most of them amount to is an attempt to bring special attention to your report, strike a note that will interest the recipient, and move him to action he might otherwise not take, that is, reply to your letter.

Anyone familiar with the field of advertising will recognize in this the basic rules of promoting a product. It may come as a shocker to hear, but many of the same approaches used to peddle soup and soap apply to reception report writing.

In advertising it is A-I-M-A, Attention! Interest! Motivation! Action! You have to be a public relations man trying to sell the idea of the station replying to your report!

No, honesty doesn't go out the window. Candor is perhaps the most effective sales technique. It doesn't mean you come on like gangbusters with the hard sell. Soft sell is usually more effective than high pressure. You still need a good product, the solid core of a good reception report. But the more you know about your "market" the better you'll be able to tailor your approach to the situation.

These special techniques you'll have to develop yourself. Your own personality, style and accumulated experience will guide you if you're receptive to the basic idea. If you're rigid, insist on a basic master report format you'll always follow, if you take the position, "If they don't like the kind of reports I write, to H--- with 'em," if you're not willing to try, try again if your first report, your first ten reports fail to bring a response, you'll miss a lot of fine QSLs!

I'd be remiss, at this point, if I didn't note that some veteran DXers aren't gung-ho about QSLs. They maintain that a QSL isn't always proof positive of reception; that some stations confirm without actually checking reports for accuracy. They're right, of course. Yet, I maintain that generally a QSLed report is better than a non-QSLed one if only because the DXer tends to be more careful about identifying the station when he tries to garner enough details to justify a report. Plus there's the thrill of receiving that rare letter from Lower West Bengalstan or whatever.

To sum up this series of articles, the key to successful DXing, as opposed to SWling, is know-how and knowledge gained through experience and the effort to learn as much about the hobby as you can. If it has struck you that the articles have been short on actual "how-to-do-it" techniques and long on generalities, it is because there is no short-cut method. All any article, series of articles or book can do is to point you in the right direction. If these have done that, and you carry through, then you are on your way to the top. ---End of Series---

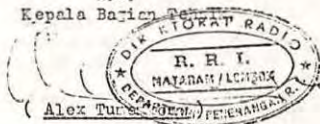

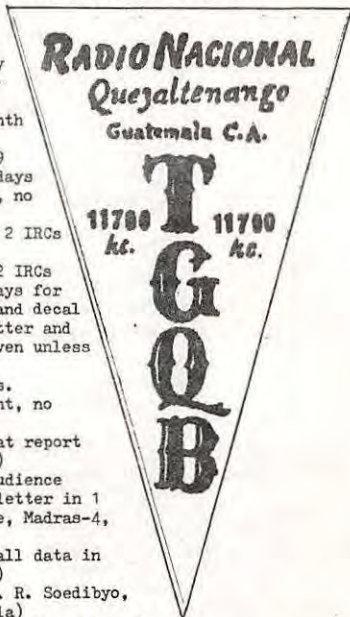

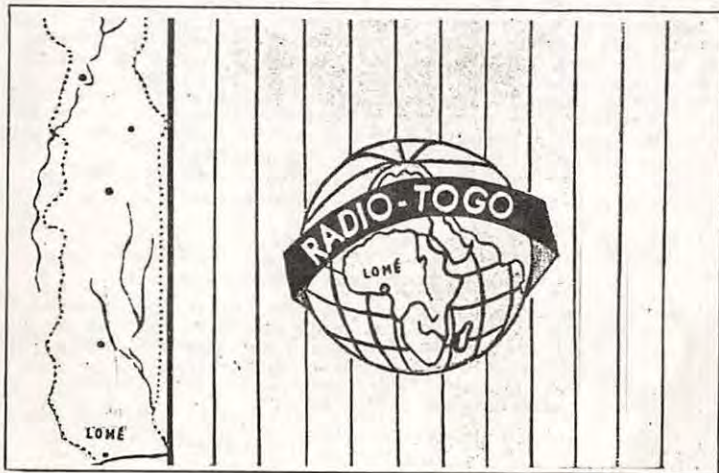

RADIO FREE AMERICA SILENT, MAY REACTIVATE SHORTLY

On October 11 a hearing was held in Federal District Court, Camden, New Jersey, to determine whether the temporary injunction against Carl McIntire's clandestine broadcasting should be made permanent. RFA's team of lawyers, then headed by former Camden mayor Al Pierce, argued that the FCC's regulations don't apply in international waters, where the anti-pirate broadcasting treaty (Geneva, 1959, signed by U.S. 1961) supercedes the FCC's prerogatives. However, the judge disagreed and, on October 24, handed down a ruling in favor of the Government. Lawyers sympathetic to RFA feel there are enough of what they see as contradictions to make an appeal worthwhile, and this appeal is scheduled to take place November 16. It may prove interesting, since former FCC Chief Counsel Benedict J. Cottone should be actively involved in his role as RFA attorney. He comes across as one whose legal and technical knowledge is ideal for this sort of litigation.

The legal approach discussed so far involves the concept of "clean hands", namely that the Government has no right to terminate McIntire's clandestine radio action when it has been doing the same thing itself for years (e.g., clandestine Radio Americas/Swan; plus such black clandestines as Red Flag Radio and Voice of the Patriotic Militiamen's Front in South Vietnam or "Pakse Radio" in Laos). There is also a question as to whether the ship-board clandestine station, Radio Free Cuba, operated for a time with the tacit consent of the U.S. Coast Guard. RFA lawyers have toyed around with the idea of subpoenaing various intelligence and counterintelligence officials who may know details of these U.S. clandestine radio operations...plus one or two other current or former high Government officials. Whether these subpoenas would be allowed or not has not yet been made known.

The plans for RFA are fluid, but come down to four basic choices:

- 1) Operating a ship under a foreign registry;
- 2) Legally reactivating WXUR;
- 3) Defying the court order and operating the ship as before; and
- 4) Giving up.

Since the last two choices are not being seriously considered, and since the second is a long shot, the most likely is the first. If this is decided upon, the approach will be unusual and should interest DXers even more than the prior operation. More on this in the December CB.

The frequency in the AM band will remain essentially the same, i.e. 1608 kHz exactly or adjusted upwards to 1610 kHz or so. The reason for the upward adjustment bears on a most unusual tactic by which RFA may return to the air and will be explained in a later issue should this strategy be adopted.

Dr. McIntire, who is a staunch supporter of Israel, has indicated he will use RFA to raise funds for the State of Israel and to relay the overseas broadcasts of the Israel Broadcasting Authority. Such a relay is technically difficult, due to the extremely high RF load that would enter a shortwave receiver's front end while RFA's transmitter was on; but either by overcoming the RF problem on board ship or by use of tapes brought to the ship from a remote monitoring post (e.g., a dinghy containing a battery-powered SFR-4 receiver and a Joystick antenna system) RFA should be able to beam Jerusalem's broadcasts throughout the northeastern United States.

MIDDLE EAST...UNDER FIRE!

With helzapoppin in the Middle East, Arab and Israeli radio schedules become of serious interest. Hence, details of the clandestine Arab "Voice of Palestine" follow, along with the tentative new winter Israel Broadcasting Authority schedule as just received here by cable from Jerusalem...too late for inclusion in Listener's Notebook.

VOICE OF PALESTINE ("Saut al-Filistine"): This is the broadcasting operation of the anti-Israeli "Palestine Liberation Organization", which controls the commando group Al-Fat'h. It beams its transmissions to the Palestine and throughout the Middle East. (con'd. on CB-4)

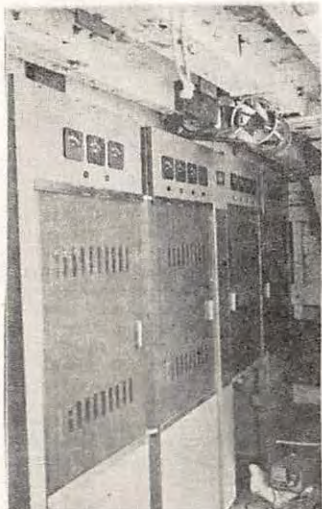

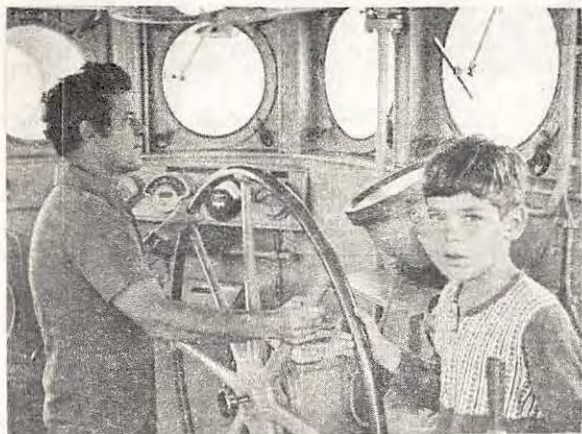

On September 14, 1973, Syria shut down the main transmitter of Voice of Palestine, located at Dar'a, arresting the staff and director, Ahmed Abdel Rahman. The reason given for this unexpected move was the station's broadcasting criticism of the recently-concluded Cairo accords...which apparently set the stage for the joint Egyptian-Syrian military action against Israel shortly thereafter. However, the BEC Monitoring Service reports that on October 17 another transmitter -- location unknown -- came on the air to take the place of the Syrian operation. Unlike the other Voice of Palestine operations, this new facility broadcasts not only in Arabic, but also in Hebrew.

Voice of Palestine programs are believed to be basically prepared at the Beirut office of the Al-Wafa ("The Faithfulness") Press Agency. All the transmitters are of significant power and can be heard oftentimes throughout the world. The best bet in North America is to tune in the RTV Algerienne program on 25 meters.

VOICE OF PEACE: The Danish Shortwave Club's Pirate Editor, Poul Foged, indicates the Peace Ship was intercepted and put off the air by Israeli gunboats at the start of the current Middle East hostilities. However, Israel's David Crystal reports in a recent (October 23) SCDX that the Voice of Peace "now is broadcasting recorded music 24 hours a day from a point fifty miles north of the Suez Canal. Reception in Tel Aviv is good."

IRANIAN CLANDESTINES: The anti-Iranian Government clandestines written up in the September CE have undergone recent changes, according to the BEC Monitoring Service. Gone altogether since October 7/8 are Iranian Revolutionaries Radio and Voice of the United Front of the Peoples of Iran. Voice of Iranian Freedom Lovers has adjusted its frequency to 7215 kHz, while Voice of Iranian Kurdistan has drifted from its nominal 9630 kHz to 9633v kHz. Ernie Behr suggests the actual hours of transmission may be 1345-1445, not 1400-1420, and presumably the 1710-1730 repeat is also extended. Finally, Victor Goonetilleke notes that jamming of these clandestine stations by the Iranian Government appears to have ceased.

TURKISH CLANDESTINES: In re. the September CE, Rumen Pankov has investigated the Our Radio verification situation and finds there is no Turkish CP office in Budapest...hence no QSLs.

SURVEY RESULTS - SPOTLIGHT, PART IV Credits for this month's spotlight go entirely to Ernst Lohe, VA/West-Germany for a job very well done indeed!

* **SUDEDEUTSCHER RUNDFUNK (SDR)** The SW tx is located at Muhlacker, West-Germany, an old site some 40 miles NW of Stuttgart operating with a power of 20 KW. Broadcasts are from 0355 til 2300, s/on on Sundays is an hour later. Best time to look for SDR is around 0600 after the strong Europeans have ceased transmissions to NA. I have also hrd SDR before s/off but not too well. QRM is too strong in general on 6030 and neighboring channels as well. Particular APRTS is on at different times whipping everything else out. In late Dec. and early Jan. SDR comes in at 2100 (NA afternoon), before the foreign svc's begin. Best bet is still to look for it in the local early morning hours. A NA DXer should try to copy some of their ads which they run in their local morning. Also nx can be hrd each half hour. QSL policy is very good. A card is issued and changed fairly often. When SDR comes in strong it is good to look for other German stations as RIAS BERLIN and BR MUNICH. R.Luxembourg might give some good indication as to how European reception will be.

* **SENDER PRETES BERLIN** is using the facilities of Radio Bremen. As far as I know, 6190 has never been reported in NA; I don't know why. The power is 50 KW although beamed towards southern Europe. The diagram shows that at least 15 KW goes towards the Atlantic. Radio Morocco uses 6190 until 0000, also R. Bucharest to NA until 0500 and then R. Morocco signs on again, not to mention the VOA in Spanish. It is hard to get a clear channel. SFB and Radio Bremen share the same SW outlet: SFB 2300-2100, RB 2100-2300. SFB is anxious to get reports in order to know the response to its transmissions. There were rumors out that they might cease SW transmissions if interest would not justify continuation. Maybe the winter months will provide some afternoon reception, but a 24 hour operation should be audible at certain times. The QSL card is also shared by the two stations, only the postal meter tells where it is coming from. However there is another chance to obtain that QSL card. Since Sudwestfunk operates its tx on 7265 24 hours, they carry the ARD all-night-program, which is produced alternating daily by each of its member stations. (ARD is the name for a loose organization of all West German radio stations). I believe every 2 weeks it is SFB's turn to take care of this nightly program. Send a report to Berlin and receive a QSL in return. It does not work with other stations. They send the report to Baden-Baden (SWF HQ's) and the QSL is the same you probably already have from SWF. Ernst Lohe VA/WG

RADIO REPUBLIK INDONESIA

Compiling an Indonesian Chart

was the task of LN's first Special Project. What is an Indonesian Chart, you might ask. No, the Indonesian Chart is not a list of the top ten records in Surabaya. The type of II Chart compiled was a chart listing all the RRI stations heard in the US in the past one year. It was not our intention to graphically list all RRI frequencies and corresponding sign-on and sign-off times. We instead included on the graph average tune-in and tune-out times as well as sign-off times which were actually observed either from year old loggings and observations or from loggings of the current period. Each frequency has three graphs, one for ECNA, one for MWNA, and one for WCNA. Our expert monitors for this special project were Dan Henderson MD, Ed Shaw VA, and Dan Jamison VA, representing ECNA. MWNA was represented by Steve d'Adolf ND, Gerry Dexter WIS, Don Jensen WIS, and Ralph Perry II. The WCNA representatives were Bill Davis Calif, Bill Flynn Calif, Dave Williams-OR, and Jim Young Calif. The objective of the II Charts is to give NASWA members an overview into the II picture on SWBC as to what stations are generally available, on what frequencies, and at what times, also combined with an "index-figure" rating the degree of difficulty of reception into the listener's QTH. Maybe we could refer to the D-O-D as the "tunability" of the station. How hard of a catch is this station? Is it there all of the time, some of the time, not very often? Establishing the "index figure" required our monitors to form a value judgement. We could not rely on S-meter readings because, as you know, different receivers give different S-meter readings on the same signal copied on the same antenna, etc. Therefore our D-O-D "index figures" are: AA..easy copy, noted most of the time, may be termed as a "bench mark" station. BB.. moderate reception, noted some of the time. CC..occasional reception noted, may be hrd only on good II days, a gen-u-line tuffie, first class DX. The "index figures" will not apply for everyone throughout the listed geographical area but should give you a good idea of what you are up against. Times listed on the charts will not be accurate for the entire DX season. Again, our times listed will provide you with a basis for comparison to see when others in your area are hearing station "X". Don Jensen has reasoned, "fade in times, etc. would vary considerably over the season ... they would tie closely to the sunrise period ((in the listener's area)). That is, for say Surakarta, optimum time would center on about 1200 early in October, about 1230 early in Nov., after 1300 in Dec., around 1330 in Jan. ((In Don's area)) I'd suggest the best indicator of when to tune is simply around local sunrise." Just as an interesting sidelight, out of the 142 identified RRI SWBC frequencies listed in the 1973 WRTH, 40.14% of them were heard in NA and were included in our survey. That breaks down further to 15.49% of them heard in ECNA, 17.60% of them hrd in MWNA, and 40.14% of them heard in WCNA. The NASWA Country List divides Indonesia up into seven countries, Bali&Lesser Sunda Is., Borneo, Celebes, Molucca Is, Java, Sumatra, and West Irian. We used the following abbreviations in the charts: K-B Kalimantan-(Borneo), LSI-J Lesser Sunda Is-Java, J Java, M Mulukkas, S-C Sulawesi-(Celebes), SUM Sumatra, WI West Irian. Also represents tune-in time, is tune-out time and is sign-off time. In the past, there has been numerous loggings of low powered non-RRI stations on out-of-band frequencies. Pacific DXer Bob Bundy has said that these small stations were probably operated by ham radio op's and they seem to be most numerous around the period of Ramadan. Quite a few of these stations operate between 2350-3200kHz, just to name a relatively active range. Many regency governments also operate SWBC stations but they operate mostly outside of the established band limits. Radio Pemerinath Kabupaten Banguwangi is one such station and has been reported in the past on 4340. The II Charts list the regency gov't station located at Poso, S-C, which operates on 5273. Another broadcasting organization which has operated in the past is Angkatan Udara, the Indonesian Air Force station. 11323 used to be very strong in NA but now it is notable absent in the bands.

GUINEA Conakry has introduced new 11965 which may replace 15310. 9650 continues in parallel. Apparently in 24 hr operation; noted 1900-0600 (Richard Wood LA)

GUYANA Action Radio is on 3290 fm 0845-1245 and 1945-0445 on W,F,Sat and also fm 0845-1245 and 1945-0445 on the remaining days of the week. 5950 is sked'ld fm 1245-1945 daily. Power on both freq's is 10 KW, driving vertical incidence antenna arrays having a gain of approx 3 db. Xntr site is Sparendaan, abt six miles E of Georgetown. (Very interesting Dave Ball, Ont.)

HONDURAS REP. HRN, La Voz de Honduras, is in regular nightly operation on 5875, noted fm 2300-0500. (thanks again Richard Dr. Richard Wood)
