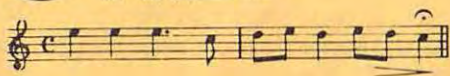

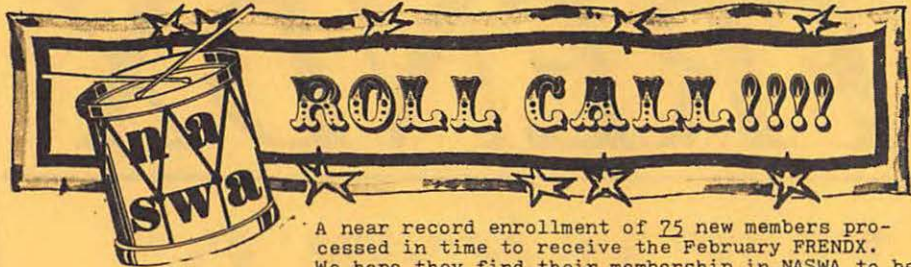

After R. Sweden moved to 21610 at 1330-1500 beamed to North America, Richard Varron, Chairman of FRC informed them of the fact that VOA was also on this same frequency at the same time and suggested they move to 21615. This improved reception.

Also, by our reports to R. Sweden, we informed them that in the mid west, the jammer on 9695 at 2300 GMT was causing a big problem with reception of R. Sweden. They were informed that 9690 was clear from 2300-000 GMT, and by means of cablegrams they moved to 9690 at 2300-0000 GMT on January 4, 1979 which greatly improved their reception.

COMMUNICATIONS RECEIVER FRG-7000

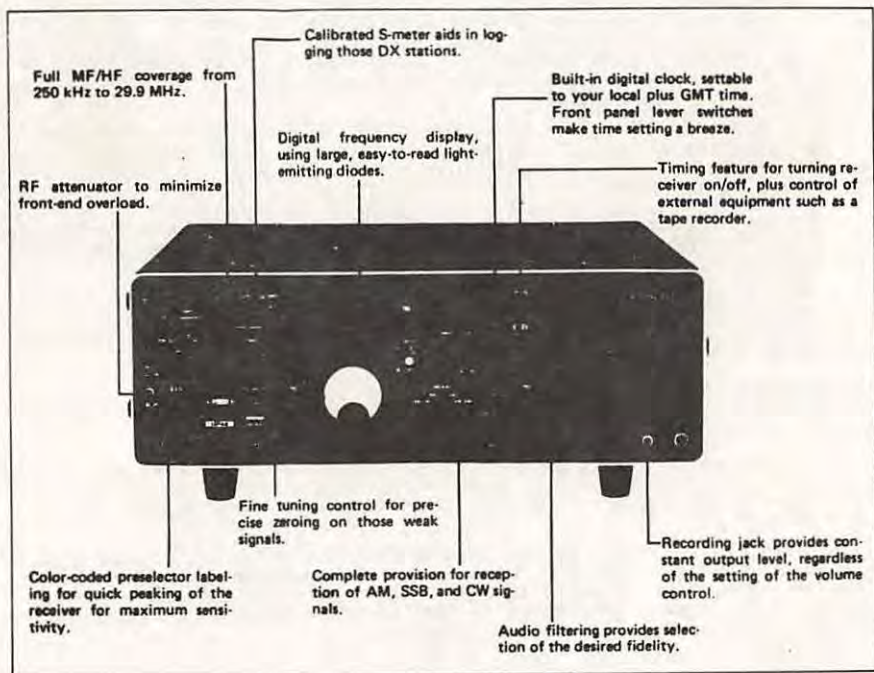

Once again your Shortwave Center editor has taken up his pen to provide our readers with needed information. The FRG-7000 is reported to be a high quality shortwave radio receiver with many features of value to DXers, yet we have not received an adequate operators review of the set. Therefore, your editor convinced Grant Manning of Radio West (3417 Purer Rd. Escondido, CA 92025) that he should loan your editor a modified version of the Yaesu FRG-7000 for review. Shortwave Center is grateful to Mr. Manning for his cooperation.

First, the FRG-7000 that was reviewed is stock except for having three switchable selectivity options on AM, the stock 6 kHz filter, the stock 3 kHz SSB filter switched to AM in the ANL position (similar to the modification described in the February 1979 SWC), and an added 2.9 kHz amplified mechanical filter. The FRG-7000 was compared in my shack against the Drake SFR-4, a Panasonic RF-2800, and a Hammarlund SP-400X, using several antennas and a variety of real-life reception situations. The results are summarized in this article.

GENERAL APPEARANCE AND OPERATION

The FRG-7000 is a colorful, well designed and laid out receiver. It has no less than 25 colored lights on the front panel, including the LEDs. Sixteen or 17 of these may be lit at any one time. In spite of this overabundance of light and color, the front panel is well thought out and reasonably comfortable to use. The figure below shows the location of the various controls.



The FRG-7000 has a rugged metal case with feet on the bottom and on one side. On the side opposite the feet, there is a carrying handle so the receiver can be handled like a piece of luggage. The front feet on the bottom are longer so that the receiver sits at a convenient angle. The receiver has its own front panel speaker.

The FRG-7000 has a built-in clock that displays local or GMT time at the flip of a switch. The clock also functions as a timer to turn the receiver or accessories on and off. Having a built-in clock that doubles as a timer is a real advantage, but I found it annoying to see the seconds flashing by while watching the nearby frequency display. There is no switch provided to blank the display. Also, the time base is 60 Hz AC and this requires that the receiver be continuously plugged into the mains. That is inconvenient for me as I am one of those nervous people who prefer to leave my receivers unplugged and disconnected when not in use, but . . . Several of the front panel switches are for regulating and setting the clock and timer. The display, by the way, is in the 24 hour format.

There are several spring clips on the rear panel for antennas and a coax connector. Several RCA style jacks are available on the back for switching accessories (i.e. recorders) on and off. The record output jack is on the front panel. The receiver requires 117 volt AC (in the U.S. version) and there is no accessory power input (because of the clock).

The receiver comes with an instruction manual that is adequate for basic operation and does contain information on maintenance and alignment.

TUNING

The FRG-7000 is a Wadley-loop type triple-conversion superheterodyne type receiver. It has a two-control preselector, a MHz knob, the main tuning dial which turns $12\frac{1}{2}$ times for the 1000 kHz range, and a fine tuning control. There is also an RF attenuator switch and an S-meter that passes 20 dB just on the background noise.

The MHz band is selected with the MHz knob. There is a light that comes on and says "unlock" when the knob is improperly tuned. Even when the light is off, the MHz knob should be carefully tuned to maximum signal within that MHz. The preselector is then set for that band following the colored lights on the switch and colored stripes on the preselector frequency dial. The main tuning dial then can be used to quickly tune any frequency in that MHz band, with about a 40 kHz overlap at each end. Frequency is easily read from the LED display that is accurate to 1 kHz without calibration. Tuning is quick within any band, yet a careful hand can tune 1 kHz at a time. The fine tuning is needed only for SSB. Changing bands requires resetting the preselector and takes a little time, but no more than for other receivers of this type.

SELECTIVITY

The most important factor in evaluating the FRG-7000 is selectivity. The FRG-7000 comes with only a single ceramic filter available in the AM mode. It is rated at 6 kHz at -6 dB and 14 kHz at 50 dB. Compare this with the SPR-4's filter at 4.8 kHz for -6 dB and 10 kHz at -60 dB, and you will see the critical difference in the skirt selectivity.

Now, the stock 6 kHz filter does provide a sufficient audio range for great sound reproduction from strong stations and will separate stations 10 kHz apart. That is fine if you want to listen to WIS, but Yaesu is selling the 7000 as a communications receiver. The typical listening situations outlined below show that the stock FRG-7000 is a mighty expensive door stop for the DXer or for a SWL that wants to listen to any but the strongest stations.

Selectivity Comparisons

The following tests were made by actual side by side comparisons on the same stations at the same time and represent my subjective evaluation. I believe they represent a typical set of situations encountered in everyday listening and are of more value to you than bench testing. Remember that my FRG-7000 has two additional selectivity choices not available from Yaesu. All other receivers are stock models.

1. Signal attenuation: How many kHz away from the carrier to you have to tune before you notice significant attenuation of the signal? (Strong AM signal)

What this means is that a strong station on 6010 kHz can be heard at an overriding level on the FRG-7000 when it is tuned to any frequency between 6005 and 6015 kHz. Or to put it

another way, the stock 6 kHz filter provides an effective strong station bandwidth of 10 kHz. The other filters cut that down to 3 kHz, a big difference.

2. Station separation: Situation, 49 metre band, two strong stations 5 kHz apart. Tune to one or the other carrier frequencies, how much interference from the other station is heard?

FRG-7000

6 kHz stock ceramic-no separation, side bands mix and both stations heard
3 kHz SSB ceramic-separate with little interference from the other station
2.9 kHz mechanical-separate with little interference

RF-2800

Wide-separate with some interference from the other station
Narrow-separate with little interference

SPR-4

5 kHz-separate with little interference

SP-400

6 kHz-separate with some interference
3 kHz-separate with little interference

The FRG-7000 with the stock 6 kHz filter did not resolve the stations, the only receiver that failed completely. Yet, with either 3 kHz modifications, separation was better than any except the SP-400 set at 3 kHz, which it equaled.

3. Locating the weak ones: Situation, 49 metre band, weak signal with strong stations 5 kHz above and below, tune to weak station, do you hear it?

FRG-7000

6 kHz ceramic-weak station not heard at all, only adjacent stations mixing
3 kHz ceramic-weak station heard with a little interference from others
2.9 kHz mechanical-same as 3 kHz ceramic

RF-2800

Wide-weak station mixing with others, unreadable
Narrow-weak station heard with some interference

SPR-4

5 kHz-weak station heard with a little interference from adjacent stations

SP-400

6 kHz-weak station heard with some interference
3 kHz-weak station heard with a little interference

No filter can remove all interference in this case of severe side band overlap, but the stock FRG was the only one that failed to locate the station desired at all.

4. Stations closer than 5 kHz, DXing situation. 60 metre band, Relej on 4832 and Tezulutlan on 4835, strong. Can they be discriminated. The signal strength in this situation is very much less than in the previous examples.

FRG-7000

6 kHz ceramic-no separation, Tezulutlan heard down to 4832 covering Relej
3 kHz ceramic-stations separated with little interference
2.9 kHz mechanical-same as 3 kHz ceramic

RF-2800

Wide-no separation
Narrow-noisy, but each heard separately with a little interference from the other

SPR-4

5 kHz-separated, but with some interference from the other

SP-400

6 kHz-barely separated
3 kHz-separated with little interference

Again the stock FRG-7000 failed to resolve the stations adequately, but with either of the modifications, performed as well as the old SP-400 set at 3 kHz, and better than the others.

TONE QUALITY, QUALITY OF MUSIC REPRODUCTION

FRG-7000

6 kHz ceramic-very good
3 kHz ceramic-fair
2.9 kHz mechanical-fair

RF-2800

Wide-very good
Narrow-good

SPR-4

5 kHz-fair with built-in speaker
very good with external speaker

SP-400

6 kHz+ - good
3 kHz - fair

As you can see from the above, the narrower the selectivity the greater the reduction in audio range. See my selectivity article in the December FRENDX for detailed discussion. The audio chopping caused by the employment of the 3 kHz filters on the FRG-7000 is noticeable, but both music and voice are still quite listenable. There is a very slight subjective audio advantage to the mechanical filter that was added to the receiver I reviewed. The built in speaker on the FRG-7000 is barely adequate and an external speaker may be advantageous. The FRG-7000 does have a tone control which is very useful in reducing high-frequency noise while listening to voice transmissions. All of the receivers tested will benefit from the use of high quality communications headphones.

SENSITIVITY

All receivers tested here have adequate sensitivity on the higher frequencies. Only the RF-2800 is weak on 60 metres. The FRG-7000 has no problems with overloading and it is rarely necessary to use the RF attenuator switch. There is no other RF-gain control on the 7000.

STABILITY

There is probably no appreciable electrical drift in the FRG-7000, but an annoying dial backlash problem permits the frequency to drift up 1 kHz and requires the use of fine-tuning for SSB reception.

OTHER OBSERVATIONS

The FRG-7000 handles RF noise interference better than the SPR-4. On the otherhand, exalted carrier SSB reception is better on the SPR-4. This along with the lack of a notch filter on the FRG-7000, makes hets difficult for the Yaesu receiver to handle.

DISCUSSION

I will be direct. In my opinion the stock FRG-7000 is a turkey. Any person who wants to listen to more than the most powerful stations will be unhappy with it. However, the simple modification to use the stock SSB filter on AM will transform the receiver into a valuable DXing tool. Let's not remonstrate with Yaesu over their motives. If you have a 7000, and are qualified, modify it. If not, then get it modified by a competent technician. If you are looking for a good, high-quality, new receiver for your shack, give consideration to the modified versions offered by several dealers.

Radio West (3417 Purer Rd., Escondido, CA 92025, phone 714-741-2891) offers the FRG-7000 with the SSB filter modified for use on AM in the ANL position for \$600.00 (October prices, write or call them for current information and availability). Radio West also offers a 3.8 and the 2.9 kHz mechanical filters for \$85 each installed. They will also provide a switchable AGC control for \$15. Write for their catalog of services and equipment.

Gilfer Associates (52 Park Ave., P. O. Box 239, Park Ridge, NJ 07656, phone 201-391-7887) also offers a modified FRG-7000. They have replaced the stock AM filter with their 4 kHz ceramic filter and have modified the SSB filter for use on AM. This package for \$625. Again, please write or call them first for latest price and availability.

BOTTOM LINE

If you have the yen for a new receiver, a selectivity modified FRG-7000 will make a great receiver for you. It may be the best available for the price at the moment. I like it (with the selectivity modifications of course) and only the absence of a notch filter makes me rank it a little lower than the SPR-4 in overall performance.

Senior DXers

DXING FOR SENIOR CITIZENS IS A GREAT HOBBY

Editor Jerry Lineback recently wrote me . . . "That people should maintain interests in things outside of their normal work throughout their lives . . . In this way they can prepare

for the years when regular labours are no longer necessary."

As a Senior Citizen I can say this. . .To all the new and old members of our fine Club NASWA, that Jerry's words are true, very true. And after having over the past 60 years made radio and shortwave listening my hobby, I feel that everyone should strive to learn more about the technical side of our hobby. The more you know of it, the more you enjoy it.

For example, how many of you took advantage of the knowledge to be gained through the free courses offered by Radio Nederland? These were "Shortwave Antenna Course," "Radio Spectrum Course," "Radio Components Course," "Shortwave Propagation Course," and "All Around DXer's Course." Perhaps these may still be available from Radio Nederland, P. O. Box 222, Hilversum, Holland.

There are also many fine books available on the fundamentals of Radio. The U.S. has several good Radio Schools, which can teach you the fundamentals of radio, and much more, through their lessons by mail. I can recommend the National Radio Institute of Washington DC from which I took several courses. These helped me with knowledge, to become a final Radio and Electric Inspector on B17s and B29s during the second world war, with 250 different radio, electric, and radar items to check on each plane.

So, while you are growing nearer to your retirement age, learn all you can about the shortwave hobby, experiment with different types of antennas, see what works the better in your location, see if you can improve your reception, experiment with different kinds of receivers, advance to using direct or digital read-out types, thus eliminating any errors in logging stations. I still recall when Dan Ferguson advised me about this item, thanks Dan. And do not forget to make a card filing index system of the many good articles each month in the Shortwave Center. There's knowledge galore there.

I was first bitten by the radio bug in 1914. Only then it was called "wireless." Several of us young boys read of Marconi Wireless Telegraph Co. of America and of their trans-Atlantic stations. Phones were used to hear the dots and dashes that were audible. We built our own "wet" batteries and our telegraph keys were made from cigar box strips, with nails for contact points, we tride hard but were too inexperienced to become wireless operators.

In 1913 I started in what was to become my life work, Motion Picture Theatre business. As a machine operator, I was able to learn about electricity, wiring, about motors, generators, and mercury arc rectifiers that changed AC to DC for theatre projection.

My first radio receiver was bought about 1923, it was a DeForest MR6, a three tube set, it required one 6 volt "A" Battery, and three blocks of 22½ volt "B" batteries, headphones were used.

It was with this set that I used my first underground antenna. This was made of 50 feet of #14 insulated wire, wound in a spiral shape, flat like a sheet of paper upon a board, and burried three feet down, the end of the wire in the ground was put into a small medicine bottle filled with sealing wax, the upper end went to the receiver. Yes, medium wave stations came in easy. I often wonder if this type of antenna would be of use today, why don't dome of you young people try it out on broadcast band stations, it may work and it may not.

My next receiver was an Atwater-Kent set, this came on an open "bread board" and not in an enclosed case. Next I got plans to build a 5 tube "Space Explorer", it was built from scratch and had 6 interchangeable 4 prong coils covering 8 to 200 metres and 200 to 625 metres broadcast. It was an AC set with a 5" dynamic speaker. Using this receiver in 1939, I received a QSL from station HP5A in Panama. Then came a Hammarlund HQ-200 set, followed by a Collins 75A3 and a code transmitter. My license was KNØBVR, but my hearing was too bad for congested CW bands and I quit the ham game. Then I took Dan Ferguson's advice and got a Drake SW4A which I still use. I am using two different speakers and a pair of Telex Twin-set headphones.

On antennas...I have built and experimented with every type known, long wire, Windom, vertical and horizontal 3 piece aluminum beam for CW bands, half wave dipole of wire, folded dipole, multiband dipole, inverted L, inverted V, and whips. Best of all in my opinion, I use a Mosley vertical SWV-7, also a Mosley horizontal SWL-7 with a Balun, also a multiband covering 31, 25, 19, and 16 metres. I made it out of 300 ohm ribbon. This is an "insulated" antenna and it works very well, sometimes on some stations it gives a higher "S" reading than the Mosleys... build one and be surprised!

Now for a tip in getting your antenna up in the air -- there is a heavy duty masting available at Radio Shack stores, that comes in 5 and 10 foot lengths made of 16 guage steel with a gold enamel finish, using guy rings and guy wires, you can raise your antenna to a desired heights. This masting holds firmly and securely, the tubes are "swaged" at one end for a tight fit. I use this masting and am satisfied with same.

I would advise (if at all possible) at your location to rely on at least 3 different antennas, oriented in different directions, such as one from north to south and another from east to west. Then, while DXing a weak foreign station, select the one antenna that gives the better reception. Always install lightning arrestors!

Now as to selecting the different antennas, I used to bring the lean-in to my table and end it in a phone plug, then plug it into the receiver, one antenna at a time. This is OK and it works, but is too bothersome. There is available at stores a 3 position coax switch, you change antennas without changing leads. There is also a CB type of this switch that works with 2 different antennas. For my use, I made a small wooden box 5" square and 7" tall with $\frac{1}{4}$ " pexi-glass front and back. In it I installed a rotary wafer switch. My three antennas each end in a phone plug, and they plug into three phone jacks at the lower back of the box, and from the switch by coax to antenna terminals on the receiver. Label the switch knob on front of the box, and you are in business.

One of my pet projects has been . . . Why doesn't someone come up with a fail-proof method of using at the same time, the combined output of both a vertical and a horizontal antenna into a receiver. I say that a system of matching networks would probably do it . . . I took this up with engineers at Radio Canada International several years ago, but got nowhere with it. The main trouble is to be able to overcome the "phase angle" of the two antennas. At least some of you readers might kick it around and see what you come up with.

Mr. Lineback told me that he hoped there would still be plenty of DXing to do when he retired. I told him that there would be plenty of it, but it will be darn sophisticated in the years to come. So you can see that as a Senior Citizen, I am glad to say that over the years I have been preparing myself for a pleasant, and happy Radio Retirement Policy, now you can do likewise. Yes, without any doubt, DXing has filled many needs in my retirement days and nights -- like when I can arise at any unearthly hour at night and tune in BBC and get the latest World News, without waiting for the morning paper to arrive.. and it has been a pleasure to share some of my experiences with you.

If I can be of any help to any one, any place in the world, regarding items in this article, I will be glad to try and help you, for in this way I will be repaying the many who helped me in years gone by. Just drop me a self-addressed envelope with a stamp on it and I will get busy.

LONG PATH OR SHORT PATH?

Each December and January, DX listeners in the eastern part of North America succeed in hearing some east Asian or Indonesian stations on the tropical bands in the late afternoon or early evening, around local sunset. It has become customary to specify these loggings as "long path", in contrast to local morning loggings of the same stations which are undoubtedly "short path."

In is my belief that in most cases, the afternoon receptions are also short path, and it is not justified to assume they are long path, unless you have irrefutable evidence, such as an unambiguous peak on a rotatable directional beam antenna -- something very few DXers have, especially on the tropical bands.

There are a few assumptions which must be accepted before we can continue this discussion. 1) Tropical band signals require a darkness path, or a darkness-twilight path. 2) Radio signals travel along the shortest possible route, between two points known as the great-circle path.

If there is a substantial portion of the short-path great-circle route in daylight during a given reception, then it would be proper to assume the signal must be going around by the second-shortest possible route, the long-path great circle. If, however, the short-path great-circle route is in darkness, what reason is there to assume the signal has gone around the world the long way? I don't believe there is any reason.

You can check this easily yourself if you have a globe such as the National Geographic one that can move freely in a great-circle ring holder. These receptions invariably correlate with proximity to the winter solstice. So let's see just which half of the world is in darkness at sunset in North America around the winter solstice, when the terminator (line separating day from night) is tangent to the arctic circle. At the moment the sun is rising in Pyongyang, North Korea (2850 kHz), it is setting along a line slashing across the USA from the Sask/ND/MT border, through Kansas: City to Biloxi, MS. Everywhere east of the line is in 'night' at the same time Pyongyang is! So why assume the signal is travelling some 30,000 km around the long way when the prime condition for propagation - a darkness path - is met via the short route of only 10,000 km?

There are more 'iffy' situations where both routes are along the 'twilight zone.' But if the short path is substantially into the darkness zone, that means furthermore that the long path has to be substantially into daylight zone. This of course makes long-path propagation even more unlikely. So let's not jump to conclusions about long vs. short signal paths, when those conclusions run contrary to the path of least resistance.

OUT OF THE PAST . . . LITTLE NRH

The amateur station in Heredia, Costa Rica that achieved international renown under the call letters HRH (which rightfully belonged to the U.S. Navy) switched in 1931 to the call TI4NRH. This station was easily heard in the U.S. and was very popular at the time. They operated from 2200-2300 and again at 0200-0300 GMT on 9830 kHz. The station was owned by Señor Amando Cespedes Marin. He was fluent in English, and anxious for listeners reports. All correct reports were verified. This station first went on the air in May of 1928 on a frequency of 9692.

Short Wave Craft magazine of Aug.-Sept. 1930 carried this item from "New York Daily Investment News."

"John Z. Adams as everybody in Wall Street knows, has made the stock brokerage business his avocation for the past 50 years, but his real vocation is radio. Several weeks ago he enjoyed a program of NRH. He immediately wrote a post card to tell the station he had received its program in Mount Vernon, New York, and asked that he be sent a few facts regarding the station, such as it's hours of broadcasting, number of watts and so on."

In due time the following letter was received from Amando Cespedes Marin.

"My dear radio fan, a post card is not always a thing to answer; it arrives by mail, unclean and looks cheap from the sender and a radio station many times does not care to pay attention to same; moreover, when it means that the sender did not have enough time or was afraid even to use INK, which is cheap and very gently looking."

"I am telling you all of that because I appreciate all good words from my listeners, BUT, surely enough, no one will get my certificate of reception which cost money, time and devotion, unless the inquiry comes full of details and as an inspiration from the miracle of radio DX hearing."

"Thus you will have to write a letter and state what you heard or what you are actually listening from NRH, and your Diploma will be mailed at once on the assurance that same will give you more light and more devotion to radio activities besides entertaining you."

"A post card is poor visiting card, or like if you were going to visit the governor of your city with a poor suit of clothes. It all counts in this life and I want all my listeners to be decent with little NRH, the marvelous station working with 7.5 watts only."

(signed) Amando Cespedes Marin

During 1935-6 Amando worked as an announcer at TIRCC, Radioemisora Catolica Costaricense, in San Jose. But one day he announced that TI4NRH would return to the airwaves on 31 metres.

TI4NRH was back on the air in 1937 on 9670. The mail address was still apartado 40, Heredia, just as it had been many years before. The transmitter was now a 500 watter and getting out well. There were still frequent announcements in English and reports were being requested. The schedule was 0130-0300 and 0430 to 0500 GMT.

I have no information on this station after 1942. The station's slogan was "The Voice of Costa Rica" and they had several interval signals but most often a bugle call. By this time "Papa" was engineer and director, while Amando Cespedes junior was the operator.

I had long since forgotten about this station until NASWA member Jack Jones brought it to my attention in discussing some old time logs (on our mighty one and two tubers) and Jack informed me that the elder Amando had written a book entitled "Me and Little NRH." To date a search for a copy of that book has been in vain, but I have not given up hope. With due respect to Senior Amando Cespedes Marin, my inquiries to book finders have been made by letter, not post cards.

This 'n That

Lots of items from the mailbox this month. I hope you don't mind if we take some space to get through some of the backlog.

Radio Shack's DX-300 finally made it to snowy central Illinois. Your SWC editor had an opportunity to tune one on display in the local store. It was presumably attached to some kind of outside antenna. I tested the selectivity, and while I could not put it to exhaustive tests like those described for the FRG-7000, it seemed that strong stations filled a 10 kHz wide slot. The selectivity did not seem to be the only problem. The DX-300 is a Wadley-loop type of receiver, and like the XCR-30 there seems to be some difficulty in tuning the MHz dial to hear the proper frequencies. I was not able to get it to tune at all on 19 metres (the only SW band I tried) and on the local broadcast band, there was a very narrow spot in the movement range of the MHz dial where the local stations appeared. There is no lock-unlock light to help. The DX-300 is an attractive receiver in appearance. It has AM, AM-ANL, USB, and LSB modes and a RF gain control. The attenuator and wide-narrow audio switches did not do much to the audio output. The speaker seemed adequate and the audio quality very good. Due to the problems with the MHz tuning and the single wide selectivity position on AM, my brief examination indicates that potential buyers should examine this receiver critically to see if it meets their expectations before purchase.

Alan Plotnick, Hamden CT, sent an item from the Christian Science Monitor 8DEC1978. Radio Station WSDR, Sterling, Illinois, has accepted an offer of free tapes from Radio Moscow. The free tapes, which must be returned to RM, are made available to stations. They include Joe Adamov's Moscow Mailbag, Moscow Meridian, and other features of RM English programming. We don't know if any of these tapes have been aired or what audience reaction might have been, but a follow up article in the Champaign-Urbana News Gazette indicated that WSDR checked with our Big Brother first. The article states that the U.S. Dept. of Justice has ruled that WSDR may broadcast commentaries provided by Radio Moscow without registering as a foreign agent. The station attorney said that the Justice Dept. wanted to be sure how the commentaries were going to be used and to be sure that the Russians were not paying to have the tapes aired. The station assured the Dept. that they would retain discretion over the use of individual tapes and would clearly label them as the Product of Radio Moscow.

Pirates Beware! An article appearing in a local CB column indicates the kinds of jams illegal radio operators can get themselves into. A CBer was caught using excess power. The FCC seized \$900 worth of radio equipment and the culprit received a \$100 fine in addition to losing his equipment. He later applied for a regular ham ticket and the FCC administrative judge ruled that the CBers past willful and repeated violations made his unqualified to hold any FCC license and denied his application. The judge wrote that the CBer's "promise of future compliance . . . cannot erase the effects of his past willful and repeated violations of the commission's CB rules."

Jim Scott of Don Mills, Ontario, sent in an amusing article on "The Forgotten Band - Nighttime is the right time for shortwave" that appeared in the City Magazine a Sunday supplement to the Toronto Star, 4 February 1979. It is a breezy and very generalized telling about what one might hear on shortwave. It contains this gem, speaking of people who buy shortwave radios, ". . . along with shortwave buffs who get their kicks through the obscure hobby known as "DX-ing" -- tuning in distant stations."

Steve d'Adolf sent in an article on the expansion of Voice of America broadcast facilities that appeared in the 25 December 1978 issue of Electronic Engineering Times. The program will take 2 years and cost \$37 million. Four 250 kW shortwave transmitters will be put into service in three locations, England, Liberia, and the Philippines. In addition, six curtain-antenna arrays will be built in England, eight in Liberia, and thirteen in the Philippines. These antennas will provide a radiated energy pattern that can be changed over angles of 30 degrees either side of the orientation of the antenna, thus providing electronic control of direction of transmission. These new antennas will replace older, less efficient antennas at the sites. The improvements at VoA will include upgrading of the 4 and 6 GHz satellite feeder systems. The VoA presently has 68 overseas stations in England, West Germany, Greece, Liberia, Morocco, Sri Lanka, and Thailand. There are 41 additional units in the U.S. About 22 million watts of radio energy are beamed out in 36 languages. VoA estimates they reach 75 million overseas listeners daily.

From time to time your editor has received letters pointing out what are considered to be mistakes or mis-statements in previously published articles. It is my thought that the

original author is responsible for the accuracy of the material submitted to SWC. Rather than my printing "rebuttals" or contrary opinions that may be equally in error themselves, and as a result offending the original author, individuals that think something printed in SWC is in error may wish to contact the original author. If there turns out to be something that really needs correction, the original author or the complainant and the original author together, may submit a revision to SWC. An alternative is for the complainant to prepare an original article on the same subject(s) outlining the situation as he/she thinks it should be viewed or done. Such articles must avoid references to the motives or intelligence of the original author.

We want all information presented in SWC to be as accurate and up-to-date as possible. The responsibility for this largely rests with the membership who submit articles to SWC.

RSA DX 11/2 via George F. Holmes, CO)
- ✓ ZAIRE The State Commissioner for Guidance, Culture and the Arts stated, per an AZAP news agency report 20/1 that his dept. had initiated a pgm to overhaul all xmtrs in the country ASAP to ensure coverage of every area of the country (BBC MS 25/1)
- ✓ W A R C 7 9 On 10/1 the Tunisian ambassador to UNESCO gave an interview in Dubrovnik to the Yugoslav news agency Tanjug in which he gave his views on the establishment of a 'new world information and communication order' by the non-aligned and developing countries. He stated that the non-aligned countries should appear as a unified front at the Geneva WARC (BBC MS 18 /1) Tanjug reported that a meeting of Radio & TV reps of Algeria, India, Korea, Cuba, Guyana, Iraq, Kenya, Nigeria, Tunisia, Yugoslavia and Zambia would take place in Havana 2/2 - 6/2. The Info Min added that agreement had been reached with officials in the countries he visited concerning installing Riyad Radio relay stations in those states (BBC MS 25/1) Speaking in Kuala Lumpur 21/1, the S.A. ITALY The people behind pirate ABC Europe are reported starting a legal private stn here. According to European Music Radio, the new stn will be called R. Nova International and will operate from Monte Fontane near Campo Rosso, directed to Riviera on FM Stereo in FR, but with EG, DT, GM during tourist season. The stn hopes to go on SW as well (Jeremy Ensom and Paul Walton, England, and R. Viking DX World, via SCDX 6/2)

INDIA Info & BC Minister, per AIR report 11/1 said there will be a considerable expansion in radio pgms throught the country when a separate national broadcasting channel is implemented. At a Port Blair news conference, he said the govt was examining the possibility of setting up 'multi-channel stations' in various places. At present AIR has only one nationwide service in Hindi & EC (BBC MS 18/1) AIR reported 17/1 that its C.E. had said after 20 years of painstaking research, Indian electronics engineers had finally established the feasibility of long-wave broadcasting in the country and had advocated a changeover to LW xmsns for AIR (BBC MS 25/1)

FINLAND FIR would like the help of SWL organizations to find out the best length for our broadcasts in EG--at present 30 mins long, but we could expand to 60 mins so we could include more than one feature program. We are boxed in by schedules in other languages, so if we went to an hour, the sked would have to look something like this: 0900-1000 & 1900-2000 to other areas; and 1400-1500 & 2300-2400 to Nam. Are there enough people who would listen to more than half an hour during the week? We already have a special 2-hour broadcast on Sundays. CANADA RCI will be moving to a building, currently under construction, five blocks west of the Maison de Radio-Canada, for the simple reason that the domestic French net wants the space we are occupying. There's nothing sinister involved. A number of other domestic net depts will also be moving into the new building (Ian McFarland, 6/2)

RCI's \$9-million budget is to be slashed by about 22% and 38 of the 205 employees will lose their jobs. Until 1968, the international service was funded by special parliamentary grants. But it was decided then to integrate it into the budget of the CBC. CRITC Commissioner J. L. Gagnon said the CBC BOD should not have power to cut the service. He said the political role played by RCI in telling the world about Canada should shield it from CBC cuts and that it should be financed directly by govt. To soften the blow of layoffs, CBC has been offering older staff early pensions. It also said that most of the 100-150 staff reduction would come about thru attrition (CP, via Montreal Gazette 20/1 via Ian McFarland; and via William Mann, REVIEW OF INTERNATIONAL BROADCASTING)

CFRB is installing a new 50 kW MW xmtr at a new site. As a result, CFRX will be going off the air because they don't have the space at the new site for a SW facility. They can't afford to maintain the SW xmtr at the old site. The new MW station will probably be on the air by Sept. 1979 or by 1980 at the latest. CFRX will be phased out about six months after the new xmtr goes on the air. All according to Paul Edgely of CFRB/X (Steve Webster, Feb DXO)

Empire Radio, hrd on 4980 around 0630 with address in Britain, phone and power as 2 kW. Probably Brith pirate usually on 48m band. Swaziland usually f/out by 0600 (Raymond Whitzman, Montreal, CMS Telegram 5/2) It was just Ghana, but why the Empire ID? (RCI 19/2) Store? (gh)

R. Sunshine despite reports of tests to Nam, is off the air. New studio being built and should return in early 1979 (Ken Baird, Scotland, SCDX 23/1) unID pirate on 7325.3 14/1 0915 pop song, very poor and fading quickly after 0930. R. Sunshine Int'l suspected as Gordon Darling reported them from England on 7325.2 (Pitt McNeil, Washington DC, TDXN)

Voice of Venus called me 27/1 so I tuned in their very poor signal on 6990 LSB at *1930--barely audible. Later 27/1 (you mean 28/1 GMT? -gh) came back on 7412v LSB *0230-0500* with much better sig and 2 ancrs. Called again 1/2 and yielded this: Tom & Scott are friends of Mike Martin. They have about 170 W PEP on SSB and kW amp on hand. Both have advanced ham tickets and are obviously from MN area. Hrd on 7490 *0316 with big sigs on LSB, later USB with pops-theme is "Life's Been Good" by Joe Walsh. Looks like there's quite a bit of activity up in the frozen north these days and I'll bet the epidemic will spread (Bill Whitacre, MI) V. of Venus couldn't be run by Voyageur people (Martin Bordt, Ont.) Mike Martin denies knowing them (Dave Walcutt) "Scott Wyld" also called me 10/2 and ran a 'special broadcast for Glenn Hauser, who is in no way associated with this station" on 7488 USB after finding that proposed 14510 was inaudible. Conscious of MARS and tries to avoid them. Gave QTH on air as "in Bloomington County on Lake Street"; opening theme "Nothin' But a Heartache". Said he is 15 years old, and a DJ friend had been killed in auto accident in last few days. Ant described once as sloping dipole, later as inverted L at 60 feet; 0641* (gh) Scott called me 13/2 and tested on 7460 USB, guitar IS 0255-0300, hrd to 0320. Plans to get AM rig; is ham, in 9th grade. Probably has called other DXers to set up test (Dick Swanson, IA) LN-14

"PRN" Pirate Radio New England hrd testing on 1620 3/2 0400, and 10/2 0500-0900 on 1625, SINPO 33344. Said they were on some nights after 0500. Is in Worcester MA, phone 617-791-1117. Power unknown, but claims hrd in a lot of East Coast states (Don Coco, Rochester NH) Hrd 3/2 0935 on 1620 offering QSLs taking calls. At 1000* gave freq as "1.278 MHz". Used

212-355-9979; hrd next day 4/2 from *0752 saying were half-power and different antenna; much poorer. On phone they said 90 watts, NW of me in MA. Certain not the same as WFAT which came on around 1015 and took calls via same phone number. After FAT off 1100*, PRN hrd weakly on slightly higher freq (Jerry Berg, MA) 9/2 at 0600 on 1620, phone ins to 212-355-9979; 0635 ID as PRN. Contemp mx. Bad audio qual. Lots of fade, tho 100% copy. "Radio Station PRN in Central New England." They played Chic's "La Freak" at 0655 whereupon I immediately flipped off my rcvr (Steven Kontos, 'the king of 1620 kHz pirate DXing', Centereach NY) 10/2 on 1624 0605 past 0845, calls to 617-791-1117. Many called for a QSL, soon to be printed. Audio problems eventually cleared up. Also IDed as "Jolly Roger Radio" and "Clear Channel Radio". Ancrs were Admiral Jolly Roger, Captain Jeff Bligh and Mr. Electricity, their engineer. Power about 100 W (Bill Yohana, NJ) They come in well here on 1624; look for Elton John mx (Martin Bordt, Prescott, Ont.)

"WFAT" hrd on 1625 28/1 0700-1100 with rock mx, taking calls; fair-to-good. 2/2 0700-1100 good, in NYC. WFAT not hrd on 3/2 when PRN was in (Don Coco, NH) 8/2 0540 phone talk show in progress (212) 355-9979 & 664-9979. Discussing Beatles. Fine audio, slight hum, no QRM, lots of fade, very strong, AM, 100% copy. 0551 "Fat Radio" 0555 jingle for "New York Weather" DJs are Larry McRae and Hal Hall. Anc'd freq is 1620. Mx played is all Beatles. Callers are also pirates, mentioned WEKZ, WLPE. 0613 taped ID jingles from stations all over country plus the "FAT Musical Carousel". WFAT is very professional, serve several important functions --plays Beatle music, parodies commercial AM radio, gives me an excuse to stay up late and drink brewskis (Steven Kontos, Centereach NY)

"WEKG" noted on 1625a Sat 27/1 1000-1103*, gave same phone as WFAT, 212-664-9979, but anc'r Kevin assured me no connexion tho he knows Larry McCrea and has seen his set up--a really efficient antenna system. Said he Kevin 'just threw some stuff together tonight and went on the air'. Said he hadn't been on for a while. Surprised I could hear him in central PA, said power like all other pirates was 'definitely under 100 watts'. Has no QSLs yet. Said he might be back once a week; mostly phone talk and pop mx, like Saturday Night's "Blues Brothers". He said 'the audience can participate without any fear' and IDs frequently as "WEKG New York". Very pleasant to talk to (Brett Saylor, Altoona PA)

"WGOR" has become very active in past few weeks with YL DJ. "WENJ" back after 9-year absence on 1615 several times during Jan & Feb local early evenings. "WELD" (Electric Light Orchestra) a fan in NYC, around 0400-0500, loop phone 212-626-9900 busy a lot. "WLIE" (Louis Thomas Edison) on air recently per David Snyder & Andrew Blumberg, BDKC, not hrd here yet. "WNCL" (No Call Letters) is on 89.7 apx in NYC on FM, run by ex-FATperson J.K. Superstar (Martin Bordt, Prescott, Ont.)

"WCBX" on 1619.7 at 2242 27/1 tune-in, disco, off & on, 2332 ID as "The Original WCXB in New York - we're gonna go to FM, WLAY!" Ancr called self "Screw Louie" and reminisced about 1972. Very strong and stable and no drift on signal (Robert L. Foxworth, Mineola NY)

"WARM" 'the hot one from the sunny shores of the Kalamazoo River, 1615 on your AM dial', alluding to heavily polluted K'zoo River, rock steady on 1611 kHz exc. one QSY to 1610. Pop mx from Kenny Rogers to quite progressive; Pryor comedy skit; pops & crackles as connexions changed, loud hums, gross impedance mismatches. Mic on all the time. Claimed 5 watts. This on 31/1, said would be back next day at 2330, but on 1/2 was at 2230-2335*. No QTH given, tho I have pretty good idea. FCC monitoring post in Allegan is only 25 miles away. Doubt audible much outside of K'zoo, but he might up power if he's ambitious. If he does, get it fast. The drive from Allegan only takes a half-hour (Andy Robins, Kalamazoo MI)

"KDOR" Los Angeles, 830, is getting a lot of promo albums which KHJ and KMET won't play. The FCC may be reluctant to put KDOR off the air because Dorwart is reportedly confined to a wheelchair and the FCC is worried about public image, etc. (Claude Hall's International Radio Report 11/1 via Bob Foxworth, RIB) Seemed back up to full 70 watts around 1/1 (SWNS)

Numbers Female with numbers in irregular groups 15/1 1410-1425 on 5860 in Korean; also 20/1 1500-1514 on 4700. Spanish 4-digit number groups after 168-1234567890 repeated. Message began 0410. At 0428 she said "grupo 268" and then into more 4-digit groups. Broke off abruptly 0445, carrier off 0446, on 5800 (James C. Clifford, Tacoma WA) English numbers on 10570 28/1 2239 177-660-584, on AM by woman; background noise. Tail-end of letter groups 12/2 2231 in military phonetics on 23455 apx. "Aifa, november, yankee, break W0-61776, end of message". Off and no return within next 10 minutes (gh)

Chile -Radio Liberation: Letelier murder trial witness Michael Townley won his stripes as an anti-marxist 'freedom fighter' when he built a clandestine mobile radio stn for anti-Allende propaganda by mounting a powerful xmtr in the rear of his Austin Mini car. During a 1972 truckers' strike against the govt, during which Allende put radio stns under state control, Townley's "R. Liberation" broadcast virulent anti-govt messages and songs--some written by Mariana Townley. He evaded the efforts by military intelligence assigned by Allende to locate the illegal xmtr (John Dinges & Kenneth Bredemeier, Washington Post 22/1 via Foxworth)

Borislav Vasiljevic, commentator on a 90-min Serbian pgm aired Suns by WIMS Michigan City IN was found shot to death on the NW side of Gary, police reported Thursday. He had been missing since 16/12. Motive unclear, but Serbian community spokesmen say they believe it was because of Vasiljevic's opposition to Pres. Tito. "This is the work of the Yugoslav secret police," said Urosh L. Seffer, pres. of the Serbian Nat'l Defense Council of America. Two other Gary Serbians had died in a similar manner in the past year (Chicago Tribune 3/2 via W. Pickard)

UN Anti-Apartheid Program On 9/1 the 1630-1650 UBC EG to Saf on 9515 contained a 20-min BC on apartheid prepared by UN Radio. The first 15 mins in EG, the rest in Afrikaans (BECMS 1/2)

Voice of Namibia via Angola fair reception past 3 days EG political talk by Afro man, into dialect 1645. Some Afro mx in EG segment; on Luanda 9535 from 1630 (G.W. Arrington, CA, 26/1)

A Voz da Verdade hrd at 1600-1700, occasionally 1500-1600 instead, on 7180, very poor signals in Johannesburg. Irr. on Mon only, new EG & vernacular Voice of the Namibian People, hrd presumably from same xmtr, 1800-1900 or 1900-2000 (Vaclav Kofinek, DSWCI SW News) Amateurish low-power efforts unlikely to have South African direct financial or technical support. Best guess is that the stn is maintained by UNITA interests, operates with Saf toleration from Ovamboland in the north of SWA (a safer place than Angola) (John Campbell, DSWCI Ed.) On 4/1, a pro-UNITA stn was hrd on 7200 at 1800. ID consisted of a cock crowing alternating with a brief musical phrase from an African childrens' choir. Three mins later, "Revolutionary greetings, compatriots and comrades. We hope you are receiving us in good conditions this evening. This is the Voice of the Good Black Man's Resistance (Port: Esta é a Voz da Resistência do bom? Negro) broadcasting Tue, Thu, Sat, Sun at 1900-2000 local on 7200". (gh: rather than "bom", it's probably either "Povo" --people, or "homem" --man). Besides nx had 30-min message from UNITA leader Savimbi. Also obs 13/1 attacking Luanda regime and Russ & Cuban presence in Angola (BBC MS 8/2) It's "Governo" (DSWCI SW News)

Voice of the Liberation Fronts of Western Somalia and Abo obs on 9586, half-hour pgms in Somali, Oromo, Arabic at 1930, 2000, 2030 resp. promoting 'the struggle' of the Lib. Fronts, but hostile to the present Ethiopian regime. No ref to QTH but 9586 carries R. Mogadishu's ES prior to 1930. Similar pgms also obs since 7/12 on R. Hargeisa fqs (BBC MS 18/1)

Voice of One Lebanon via xmtrs believed to be in Iraq on 9510 and 6170 has not been obs for some time and are thought to have been discontinued (BBC MS 25/1)

Voice of Lebanon has switched from "Bridge on the River Kwai" to "Quo Vadis" as theme song; and Voice of Arab Lebanon, I think the Nasirite bunch, operate from a bombed-out apartment in Ashrafiyah, a pretty much demolished suburb of Beirut, per a report on CBC SUNDAY MORNING (Richard Stoller, NY, REVIEW OF INTERNATIONAL BROADCASTING) of LN-5

National Voice of Iran, Persian-lang clandestine beamed from Baku in Soviet Azerbaijan, and other Soviet outlets, have accused the CIA of sending in scores of agents to try and prop up the Shah, and have also charged US Army generals with conspiring in a coup to restore him. The American Embassy in Moscow protested that Soviet news accounts were misrepresenting US policy and diplomats said the clandestine broadcasts to Iran from Baku were 'inflammatory'. The impression has been fostered abroad that all Iran listens breathlessly for its daily instructions from Soviet radio, which broadcasts 45 minutes a day. But a recent Western intelligence report noted there is no evidence that the broadcasts incited Iranians to violence. The Baku radio called on Iranian soldiers this week to establish 'revolutionary councils' and resist 'treachery' by their commanders (Craig R. Whitney, 27/1 New York Times, via Foxworth) Xmsns increased at end of Jan from National Voice of Iran, "Seda-ye Melli-ye Iran", anti-Shah and Anti-Iranian govt on 6025 kHz to: Farsi 1730-1745, 1800-1815, 1930-1945; Azerbaijani at 1745-1800 & 1945-2000 (BBC MS 2/79)

Radio of the Patriots, Persian-lang clandestine via Libya daily 1615-1645 is now on 15100, 9650, 7200 (BBC MS 25/1) Now on 11700, 11600, 9650, 9500. "Radyo-ye Mihan Parastan" is pro-Islamic anti-Shah, anti-Iranian govt (BBC MS 2/79 & 8/2) US officials believe both National Voice and Patriots are controlled by the USSR. Address of Radio of the Patriots is a PO Box in Sweden. But Iranian electronics experts believe it has operated from East Germany, Bulgaria and the USSR (AP, 30/1 via NY Times 31/1 via Bob Foxworth & Malcolm Kaufman, NY) My novel guess is that the indirect influence of the KGB on R. of the Patriots must be rather strong (John Campbell, DSWCI) See ISRAEL, LN-4 "Samleng Pracheachon Kampuchea" (Asia Week, NFEDEXR):

Voice of the Kampuchea People on 23/1 obs on 6088, 4907 and 917 kHz // usual 9753 7350 760. The new fqs are practically identical to those used by the former R. Democratic Kampuchea which broadcast from Phnom-Penh prior to 7/1. 9753 is practically identical to the channel that carried R. Vietnam's "C" DS before the fall of Saigon in 1975. MW 760 is the same as the 50 kW VOA-Hue (BBC MS 25/1) VOKP anc'd 1/2 that from 5/2 on its pgms could be heard only on 6130, 4907 and 940; however it continued to use 9695, 6088 and 917 after 5/2. These xmtrs are near Phnom Penh. VOKP on Viet fqs 9753, 7350 and 760 were in use thru 4/2. VOKP now operates from P-P only at 0400-0500, 1100-1300, 2300-2400, times broadly similar to those employed by the former R. Democratic Kampuchea (BBC MS 8/2) VOKP operated 2200-1700 in Cambodian on 9753, 7350, 760 from south Vietnam; pro-Vietnamese stn (BBC MS 1/79) Hrd as of 27/1 at 1100 past 1300 on 7350, 9753 (Mike Willis, Victoria)

Voice of Democratic Kampuchea ceased broadcasting 7/1, resumed 16/1. As received in Bangkok, same format as before, bellicose support of 'patriotic war against Vietnamese aggression.' Intelligence sources point out that it is transmitted from Yunnan Province in the PRC (Asahi Shimbun 17/1 & Asia Week 26/1 via NFEDEXR) VODK signs on with same music as before, and at 2355* the nat'l anthem of Demo. Kamp. "The Great Victorious 17th April" played with chorus. But both music are slightly different versions from what was broadcast from Phnom Penh (Isao Uguza, NFEDEXR 29/1) NY Post says it's from Kunming, southern China (Andrew Blumberg, NY) Sked anc'd 18/1 of 55-min xmsns: 2300 on 15600, 9470; 0400 on 17705, 11725; 1200 on 11990, 11600, 1500 on 15270, 1188. 2300 also obs on 11660 and 1200 also on 6825, all fqs used at other times by R. Peking ES. 1188 kHz is at Kunming, per 1975 Geneva Plan. This stn is

pro-Pol Pot regime (BBC MS 25/1 & 1/79) Hrd 28/1 on 11600 from *1157, weak jamming beneath (Jerry Berg, MA) It beams pgms giving encouragement to the Pol Pot scattered troops as they fight out the war in the west of the country (Mike Willis, Victoria) Radio has "Kill-a-Viet" course. The exile radio of the fallen Khmer Rouge Cambodian regime said yesterday it will begin broadcasting an educational course on guerrilla warfare to teach loyalist listeners how to kill Vietnamese. The one-hour, daily course is scheduled to begin today, from 7 to 8 p.m. local time each evening. Presumably, troops will be expected to apply their lessons later in the night (UPI Bangkok, via Providence Journal 7/2, via John Fisher, MA) more, LN-14

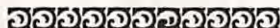

When I tried to 'peak' a particular Mhz band using the Mhz tuning dial, I either got buzzes and groans coming out of my speaker, or stations which just didn't belong at the displayed frequency. So far I've tried three different samples, all of which have demonstrated the same problem to one extent or the other. Visitor from Peking

His name is Chi, or Ji Fu-Sheng, a communications technician from the People's Republic of China. Chi is one of about 40 Chinese scholars now studying English at American and Georgetown Universities in Washington, D.C., in preparation for their move to places like UCLA, Berkeley, Cornell, MIT, and Carnegie-Mellon. They will be in this country for two years, some of them for a longer period of time, and they are merely the first of many groups that will be arriving in the United States. Washington was crackling with excitement during Teng Hsiao Ping's visit, and I was anxious to meet as many of the Chinese scholars as possible. I had spent years listening to Radio Peking's broadcasts, which, during the Vietnam war, were so critical and downright vicious in their denunciation of U.S. imperialism in Indochina. Now the tables have turned, and China's leadership, as vulnerable as it may be to sudden shifts, is looking toward the building of a "modern" China by the year 2000. Chi Fu-Sheng is one who plans to return to China, in his case to Peking, to play a part in that modernization process.

We shortwave enthusiasts have had a unique and exciting vantage point from which to observe the growing U.S. - China relationship--that of radio broadcasts from the source. With this in mind, I invited Chi to my home recently for a shortwave radio demonstration. Also on hand were French DX'er Jean Jacques Bloch, and Pitt McNeil. As the beautiful sounds of The East is Red drifted from the Hammarlund's speaker, Chi gave us his frank opinions on the Chinese-Vietnamese conflict: "They attacked the border of our country, and we have asked the UN to get them to take their troops out of Cambodia. . ." Did the Vietnamese attack Chinese border posts first, I asked. Chi nodded and continued: "They. . . I don't think they have the capacity to wage true aggression, but they want to make trouble. We will give them a punishment. . ." I told Chi that it was my own opinion that economic problems are now more important for the American people than risking conflict anywhere in the world, to which he replied: "This is my own personal opinion, my private opinion. . . I can't really understand Carter. . . the American people don't want any war. But if you always take back from "attack" you will be attacked again. We Chinese, in our history, suffered a long time from oppression. . ."

I played a recording of the 9945 outlet of Radio Peking for Chi, but as it was in Cantonese he could not understand it. Yet, he was truly fascinated by the technology (represented by the shortwave radios) available to a student like myself. If the present leaders in Peking adhere to the saying "Seek truth in fact," the fact is that China is terribly far behind with regard to even some of the simplest technology we take for granted on a daily basis. According to Chi, there are only some 1.2 million television receivers in the whole of China. Most radio receivers, up until just recently, consisted of the basic 5 tube pattern, and Chi should know--he worked on them. But perhaps the most surprising revelation came in the answer to my query about how many Chinese listened to foreign broadcasts. The Voice of America, or just plain "VOA" as they call it, is apparently quite popular in China. Chi was, I think, more taken with the Japanese portable RF-2800 than with the Hammarlund or Drake. Possibly, he was taken with the advanced state of receiver technology in Japan, with which China has also normalized relations in its quest for modernity.

For one evening, we learned quite a bit about one another. Chi said he will be coming back to listen to some other broadcasts, and several of the others in the Chinese group will be here as well. But I will not soon forget that initial feeling, upon meeting these people, the feeling that I was meeting people who have been kept from reality for a long period of time, who, in a sense, were being released from a form of bondage, physically and mentally. China's move toward the West will not be at the expense of their ideology. As Chi said, as we listened to the Radio Peking North American Service playing John Philip Sousa marches, China does not want to be as modern (in all respects) as the United States by the year 2000. The object is to become "more modern than we are right now." Later that evening, after I had driven Chi home, I hit the button on my Taiwanese manufactured cassette recorder and listened for a while to some Chinese music from Radio Peking. My thoughts ran to the Vietnam war, China's "invasion" of Vietnam, cries here in the U.S. to reopen the draft, and finally, to a new friend from China, one of almost a billion of the world's population.
