Antennas

THE BEST ALL-PURPOSE ALL-BAND RECEIVING ANTENNA

In my ten years of hobby participation I have devoted hundreds of hours to antenna experimentation. My QTHs have ranged from apartments to mobile home parks to the present top-of-the-mountain location with virtually unlimited space for hanging many wires of various shapes and sizes. Experiments have included many designs, from short helical and coil-loaded models to a 300 foot V-beam and a 700 foot longwire. Although many of the larger types have been specific purpose antennas, I've always had it in the back of my mind to find the best all-purpose SWL-DX receiving antenna for the person living on an average-size lot.

The Winner is - - - The Inverted-V, cut as long as possible in accordance with the half-wave dipole formula (468 divided by frequency in MHz) for the lowest band DXed, connected to the receiver through a suitable coax tuner. The tuner used here is the MFJ Econo Tuner, available from MFJ Enterprises, Inc., P. O. Box 494, Mississippi State, MS 39762. Price was \$29.95 plus \$2.00 shipping about a year ago.

The Inverted-V antenna is basically non-directive, or omnidirectional if you prefer. Sensitivity from all directions is excellent. Only one tall support is required, that being in the center. The ends can often be attached, through insulators and non-conductive rope, to existing fence posts, tree trunks, etc. Height of the ends above the ground needs only to be 10 or 15 feet.

The Inverted-V is the QUIETEST antenna I've tested, in terms of signal to noise, except for very large (for lowband reception) full wave and multi wave designs which are impractical for most DXers and which even when space available permits their erection are very difficult to keep up in the air through the various year around weather conditions, unless very ruggedly constructed. This antenna, because of its fine signal to noise performance, does a very good job of digging out weak signals in a noisy band that is fading in or out or just not propagating well. The background hiss and buzz in this type of situation is nearly always reduced or eliminated, in comparison to a singlewire antenna. The above also holds true in comparison to the ground-plane vertical, though, to a somewhat lesser degree. Simply stated, this can often mean the difference between knowing that "someone is there" and being able to copy and identify the station. The value of this advantage doesn't need to be explained to any DXer.

Relatively inexpensive RG-58/U coax is just about a perfect match for this antenna and for almost all receivers in use today. It is also sturdy enough, when properly constructed and supported, to stand up to most weather conditions. An inexpensive coax-to-antenna connector can be made from a small plastic pipe TEE and three hose clamps.

Construction Notes:

A center-height of at least 35 feet is recommended, higher if possible. Included-angle at the apex should be 90-120 degrees. The hose clamp holding the coax to the TEE should just be snugged up so as not to squeeze the coax flat and change it's impedance. The soldered coax-to-antenna connections should be carefully weather-proofed with silicone sealer. Heavy duty insulated lampcord is an excellent choice for the antenna wire. It is easily split down the middle, thereby giving two exactly equal lengths-important in a dipole-type antenna.

ADDING A Q-MULTIPLIER TO THE HQ-180 RECEIVER

Since I prepared my previous article (April SWC) on the HQ-180, I have added a Heathkit QF-1 Q-multiplier. Originally sold 20 years ago in kit form, the assembled QF-1 Q-multiplier

can sometimes still be found on the used equipment market for around \$25. The unit is housed in a gray metal cabinet 7 3/8" W x 4 11/16" H x 4 1/8" D, and is connected to the receiver by two cables. One is a 3-wire shielded power cable in which the red lead goes to B+ 150-300 volts, white (or black) goes to the 6.3 volt filament point, and black (or white) and the shield go to ground. All of these values are available directly from the accessory socket on the rear apron of the HQ-180A. (Being unable to find a plug to match the socket configuration, however, I drilled a 1/8" hole in the rear apron, installed a grommet, fed the wire through and wired it directly to the inside pins of the socket.) The other cable ends in a phono plug, requiring that a corresponding socket be installed on the rear apron. One end of a piece of shielded cable is then connected to the phono socket (shield to ground). At the other end the center conductor should be connected to the plate connection (pin 5) of V17 (a 6BA6), and the shield to the nearest ground point. That is the extent of the wiring that is necessary. Since the Q-multiplier weighs very little, I found it convenient to bolt it down to the hinged access cover on the top of the receiver in order to give it some stability while in use. This way it also swings out of the way when the cover is opened.

After connection, the Q-multiplier must be aligned by adjusting its three internal coils. The S-meter is used for this purpose and no test equipment is necessary.

The Q-multiplier has four controls, an "off-sharp-null-broad" selector switch and "null adjust," "peak adjust," and "tuning" controls. The device is essentially a tunable, regenerative amplifier that is connected to the receiver IF circuitry and that acts as a gate through which the IF signal must pass. It is used to peak or null a particular signal. I find it most useful in the "sharp" position, where the "peak adjust" and "tuning" controls can be set to provide very sharp, steeply skirted selectivity. Though the higher audio frequencies are unavoidably attenuated somewhat in this sharp mode, the attenuation is modest enough to still permit surprisingly good intelligibility. The "null" position is similar to the slot control on the receiver itself. The "broad" peak position allows higher gain than the "sharp" peak position when a wider bandpass is acceptable.

One must use the 180 with a Q-multiplier to appreciate the versatility that results. Suffice it to say that among the receiver selectivity and slot controls and the Q-multiplier controls, it is possible to select from among a virtually infinite number of operating combinations to peak or eliminate a particular signal. The author also uses an Autek QF-1 Active Audio Filter with his 180, adding further to the receiver's flexibility. It is such flexibility that is the critical factor in the most difficult DX situations and that usually makes the difference between hearing a station and not hearing it.

"WHAT-COMMUNAL DX?"

DXing is most often viewed as a solitary hobby, bringing to mind visions of headphones clamped on at 2 AM while wife or mother is begging you to get some sleep. In this article I would like to show that sometimes the best DX comes in larger number of DXers. At times, you might have noticed rare loggings in the Log Reports followed by six or seven names, and it might seem, as Dan Robinson once stated, "Hey guys, looks like you were listening on the same radio." Well, maybe not the same radio, but the same room. When I joined NASWA in the winter of 1979, I quickly discovered that I was the eighth member in greater Johnstown, the number now being ten. A few phone calls later and I got to meet six other DXers in my age group right here around town. Besides listening to Monty Python records, it seemed that one of their favorite activities was listening in large groups, called 'DX sessions.' In 1979, I attended seven of these, and a full one third of my new stations heard during the year and one-fourth of the new countries that I heard were during these get-togethers. I have figured with up to seven DXers monitoring the bands at the same time, that my chances of hearing a new station or country were twice that of my DXing alone. Not only does it help when we are in the same room, but in between get-togethers most of them are only a phone call away, and we are always informing each other of good catches or comparing notes on some elusive station, to each other's mutual benefit. Our average starting time is 0000 GMT and we are usually done by 1300, for an average length of 13 hours. This gives us a chance to hear the Africans signing off, then the Latin Americans, the Africans coming back on, then Oceania and Asia, before we finally find a place on the floor to stretch out until the early afternoon. The scene is sometimes hectic, if you can picture seven receivers, five or six tape recorders, along with other equipment, fitted around a table, and gradually being littered with empty pop cans and half empty bags of munchies. It is not unusual for us to stop and spend ten dollars on junk food before we even get to the site for listening. In the last year I have jumped from 102 to 173 countries heard, and my stations heard have doubled from just over 200 to 430 in the same period, and I could not have done it without

the help of these other guys. So, before I go any further, let me introduce them. I have an R-390, and though I am sometimes known to boast of my receiver, I am sixth of the seven members of the Three Mile Island DX Association with my 173 C/H. Doug Wicks and Jeff O'Donnell live ten miles up the road in Mineral Point, and Doug is referred to as the senior statesman, even though I veried my first station at age nine back in '69. Doug has garnered 184 countries with his DX-150A. Jeff wrote an article last spring on budget DX with the DX-40, and before it was even printed he bought himself a DX-160. In a little over two years of SWLING, he has already heard 177 countries. Former Distribution Editor Dave Valko lives in another small burg named Dunlo, about 15 miles away. Dave also operates a DX-160, and has 179 C/H. The newest DXer in the group is Ed Berzonsky, from Elmora, in the north of the county. Ed has only heard 50 or 60 countries so far on his DX-160, but how many people do you know with those totals who have heard the Falkland Islands, Mongolia, Nepal, Tanzania, the Solomons, etc. Your present LR-E editor, Brett Saylor, lives a little farther away in Altoona and also owns a DX-160. His is equipped with an LED frequency readout, and he currently leads the pack with 185 C/H. The furthest member at 130 miles, is Don Moore of Bellefonte. Don is our resident Spanish and Portuguese expert, having verified scores of Latin American stations, and hearing nearly seventy Brazilians, while totaling 183 countries on his XCR-30.

The first three sessions that I attended were small in attendance, and this definitely affected the success of numbers two and three. Dave and Jeff stopped off at my house for number one, and I was soon impressed as I nailed 17 new stations and 3 countries in 13 hours of DXing. A month later, in April 1979, the same three of us were at Dave's shack, and DX was nil after hearing La Voz de los Galapagos. The rest of the night was spent with Jeff and I discussing Jeff's love life, while Dave took notes (Dave takes notes on anything, if he can get a QSL out of it). Dave and I tried it again in Dunlo, but we were asleep by 0700. Something had to be wrong. It seemed that things were going downhill fast. On July 22, all seven of us were present in Altoona. This is generally recognized as the first organizational meeting of the TMIDXA. A little later we got the urge to turn on our receivers, and with Don's aid, I had soon logged eight new Brazilians. We later heard Aden, and I finished the night quite pleased, with 19 new stations. Definitely the answer had to be in having more DXers present, and also some decent conditions. On September 1, all but Don were on hand in Dunlo, and although I only heard 8 new stations, they included Radio Panamericana on 6034, as well as Sierra Leone and the Voice of Malaysia, both of which I QSLed. (Which is a feat, considering I have only 39 countries verified). By this time school was ready to start, Dave went to Pittsburgh, Jeff and I retired to Pitt-Johnstown, and the rest were at Penn State.

In November, our annual After Thanksgiving Get-Together was held at Brett's QTH. Don Moore presented the TMIDXA constitution for ratification, and after several suggested changes, it was sent back to committee. By this time it was almost 0000 GMT, and we tried for the new station in the Argentine Antarctic. There was definitely a station there in Spanish, and later it was IDed by a tape we had made. Before 0100, audio had been noted on 2370 and everybody rushed to the frequency. One song was made out, a woman talking, and at 0129, a few strains of God Save the Queen faded up through the static. You never saw six DXers as happy as we. The rest of the night wasn't as eventful, although at 0600 Tunisia was blaring in on 1566 kHz MW. That encouraged me to do some Trans-Atlantic MW DXing, while the rest cooked hot dogs and sang along to Monty Python.

In a group like this, even though there may be no DX, there is never a dull moment. And then, on December 28, a date that will forever live in the annals of DXing, we all congregated at the Wicks household in Mineral Point. His was not as roomy as Brett's so four of us were in the dining room, while the two others were stationed in the kitchen. Brett started things off by playing a tape of AWR-Andorra booming in in Altoona, and everybody sat down and tuned them in person, not thinking much of it (until my QSL card said they were only 3 kW). At 2100 Doug and I went to string some antenna wire, and completing that we all retired to the living room floor to be entertained by The Cat. Dave was the first to return to his rig, and at 0115 was heard to exclaim, "Hey Brett, Falklands is coming in on 2370." Brett immediately made his way to the DX-160, clamped on the headphones, flicked the dial until 2370 flashed on his LEDs, and said, "Naw, that can't be them, it's coming in too good. Must be a harmonic," remembering 2370 is 3x790. We all made our way back to our posts and proceeded to tune this mysterious signal. At 0128, a woman came on and said, "This is the Falkland Islands Broadcasting Station. . ." and six dull thuds were heard as each of us fell on the floor. Luckily, Brett and Jeff had their recorders running, and as soon as God Save the Queen had faded into oblivion, we were constantly rerunning the tapes listening for details.

This occupied our time for the next couple of hours, and after I caught Sudan at 0400, Dave and I went down to a local watering hole to catch a couple pizzas. When we got back, the gang was in the cellar, as Doug's brother was recording the reception onto a reel to reel tape, so that it could be sent to the station. Once again we listened to that marvelous ID, which had to be the best anybody had ever heard them in North America. Right then, Doug's Sister-in-law blurted, "What did she say?" Around this time, I noticed the smell of burning

pizza, and rushed upstairs just in time to salvage it with only brown cheese and a crispy crust. The Voice of Lebanon was heard in between crunches, and then I went about logging the West German regionals, while the second pizza was being prepared. Soon darkness hit the Pacific, and I had a tentative 900 watt Japanese on 3607. West New Britain was doing quite well, and Brett logged Sumatra, but somehow I didn't get the word and missed them. Jeff then heard Greenland's sign on, but only Doug was able to get there before it was lost. I then had a signal on 7384, and thought immediately of Laos. After 20 minutes of a woman talking, I went to 3995, and heard what I thought might be Borneo. At 1155 I decided to check on 7384, and found it much better with no UTEs, revealing seven time bells and a national anthem on the hour. I was immediately called down to 3425, and soon Himalayan hymns from Radio Nepal filled the air. A month earlier four of the others had heard Radio Ulan Bator, and Jeff harassed me constantly because I only had a tentative on another frequency. Dave and I then decided to explore for Mongolia, and this worried Jeff. 12070 revealed nothing but the Russian, and Jeff breathed slightly easier, but then Dave found them on 6383 and Jeff was crushed. By this time it was almost 1250, and when I went back to 3995 Borneo was gone, and nothing has been heard there since.

We plan to trek back to Mineral Point during the term break at Penn State and erect the same hallowed wire, and who knows what we may hear this time around. One thing's for sure, I'll have two radios with two tape recorders present, so if I have to leave a frequency to check out another station, I'll have the tape keeping tabs on the original station.

EARLY RADIO HISTORY: AGITATION FOR THE MASSES

(NOTE: The following is a letter written to Joseph Stalin by V. I. Lenin on 19 May 1922. The perceptive Lenin understood the tremendous impact that this newly invented communications medium could have on the masses. The letter was published in Pravda in 1949 and appears in Lenin, Collected Works, V. 33, Progress Publishers, 1965, P. 360-61. John Hedstrom 814 E. Illinois, Wheaton, IL 60187, has researched this matter and submitted the material to SWC.)

To Comrade Stalin with the request to pass this round to all members of the Political Bureau

Comrade Stalin:

Appended are two reports. The first from Professor Osadchy, an expert on electricity, about radio-telegraph and telephone communication; the second is from Bonch-Bruyevich. This Bonch-Bruyevich, whose report I append, is a prominent specialist and inventor in radio engineering and one of the principal figures at the Nizhni-Novgorod Radio Laboratory.

These reports show that it is technically quite feasible to broadcast human speech over any distance by wireless; furthermore, it is also possible to use many hundreds of stations that could broadcast speeches, reports and lectures delivered in Moscow to many hundreds of places throughout the Republic, situated hundreds and, under certain conditions, thousands of versts (km) away from Moscow.

I think that from the standpoint of propoganda and agitation, especially for those masses of the population who are illiterate, and also for broadcasting lectures, it is absolutely necessary for us to carry out this plan. Considering the unfitness of most of the bourgeois professors of social sciences whom we are using and even the harm caused by them, we have no other way out than to enable our few communist professors, who are capable of delivering lectures on social sciences, to deliver these lectures for hundreds of localities in all parts of the Federation.

I am therefore, of the opinion that under no circumstances should we stint funds to complete the organisation of wireless communication and produce efficiently working loudspeakers.

I propose that we pass a decision to allocate, as an extraordinary measure, a sum of up to 100,000 rubles from the gold fund over and above the estimate to organize the work at the Nizhni-Novgorod Radio Laboratory in order to accelerate to the maximum the completion of the work it has begun to instal efficient loudspeakers and many hundreds of stations throughout the Republic, which can repeat for the broad masses the speeches, reports, and lectures delivered in Moscow or some other centre.

The Council of Labour and Defence must be instructed to organise special supervision over the expenditure of this fund and, perhaps, if it proves to be expedient, to institute bonuses from the above fund for specially rapid and successful work.

Let me add that today's Izvestia carries a report about an English invention in radio-

telegraphy that transmits radio-telegrams secretly. If we managed to buy this invention, radio-telephone and radio-telegraph communication would be of further tremendous significance for military purposes.

MICROCOMPUTER MENACE

I've been an active SWL for years and have had to put up with a wide variety of interference from local doorbells, thermostats, neon signs, street lights and power lines to name a few sources of noise. Living in an apartment building surrounded by appliance users it's what one would have to expect. If I were to go around installing filters and tracking down every zap and pop, it would be a steady job, so I limit my investigations to only the most severe cases. My standard has become: If it can be heard on the AM broadcast band, it's bad enough to do something about. My DX ability suffers, but I still manage to pull through a lot. I have been reasonably content with the situation but with the advent of the home microcomputer the future looks dim.

I purchased a Radio Shack TRS-80 and was delighted with it in every way until I tried using a program to turn my radio on at a certain time while I was away from home. Suddenly I was hearing strange humming and buzzing sounds at frequent intervals on the SW bands. I pulled off the antenna and they disappeared, so I wasn't getting QRM direct from the micro to the radio though they were only a few feet apart. Rather I was picking up the RF "hash" with my rooftop antenna over 50 feet away and two floors above! When a short ribbon cable of several inches was connected to the output connector of the TRS-80, my FRG-7 s-meter jumped up considerably.

This would never do. I tried everything I could think of to shield the micro, even putting it inside a box lined with aluminum foil and grounded. There was variation in strength of the RFI, but it was never reduced to a tolerable level. I don't have a good ground where I am on the second floor and I'd be willing to bet my "ground" was acting more like an antenna as with different configurations of my shielding the RFI would peak at different frequencies on the radio.

What did I end up doing? I gave up! I just don't have the micro on while I'm SWLing. Screening of the micro cabinet, shielding of the ribbon cable, heavy ground strapping, nothing worked. A recent article in QST dealt with the problem and the steps the author had to take to quiet the thing down were incredible. A spectrum analyzer display showed almost solid RF generation over a very wide bandwidth including the SW spectrum. When you imagine 100,000 of these already sold and more selling every day, it seems to pose a menace to radio listeners. It's one thing to pop a filter on a TV or a capacitor across arcing contacts. It's something else to ask someone to undertake the procedures necessary to silence a microcomputer. Most would just refuse.

The other day I was listening on 21 MHz and heard those familiar sounds. Sure enough, a neighbor was using his microcomputer and his apartment is directly beneath my antenna. I went over and told him about it. He had a separate terminal and two disc drives in addition to the micro with that notorious ribbon cable running everywhere. We tried to arrange a schedule to avoid interference but it's no fun having to SWL on a schedule to avoid interference.

If I sound depressed, I am. In addition, I may be causing interference when I use my

micro. My only suggestion to you, the reader, is to avoid the plastic cased TRS-80 in favor of a micro with a metal enclosure such as the PET or Heathkit and if you connect peripherals, keep the ribbon cable as short as possible.

If anyone has a story about good results in microcomputer RFI suppression, let me know.

(Editor's Note: This and similar interference should be reported to the manufacturer and to the FCC so that standards of RFI can be developed and enforced.)

Drake R-7

THE DRAKE R-7

I recently received my R-7 which had been on order for 7 months! All the reviews that I have read have given it very good grades, which has made waiting even harder. Now that I have had a chance to use it and compare it to my SPR-4/FS-4 combination, I must agree that it is a fine receiver.

My first Drake was a R4-0 which I did not like due to the poor audio and high background noise/hiss. I then did some dealing and wound up with a SPR-4/FS-4 combination. I felt this was a vast improvement, noise was less but sensitivity was still excellent, also it ran off 12 VDC which gave me something to take camping.

The R-7 keeps all the desirable features of both the above sets, e.g. 12 V operation, passband tuning, good selectivity, notch filter, switchable AGC and adds several other features. I especially like the antenna selector which allows two antennas and two receivers to be used in any combination. In addition a third input which has a high degree of isolation (75 dB) can be connected to the R-7. This is an ideal place to connect your amplified BCB loop and not have interaction with other antennas.

SENSITIVITY AND OVERLOADING: Both receivers are sensitive with the edge going to the R-7. On the higher bands the SPR-4 is quieter and every bit as good in digging out the weak signals. However, on the BCB bands there are problems with the R-7. According to the S-meter there are 7 local AM stations that put in more than 50 dB over S-9 signals, four of them sit at 75 dB+S9! This is a handful for any set, but the SPR-4 can handle it better. The antenna is a 75 foot random wire at 40 feet. The R-7 is a mass of distorted locals and junk, the SPR-4 is quite wide on locals but does not produce very many images when the preselector is tuned correctly. Agreed, the R-7 is more sensitive on MW, but I still get spurs, etc. with a few feet of wire in the basement. The LW band is good, no BCB heard here, and I have not noticed any harmonics from the switching power supply that was mentioned in earlier reviews.

DIGGING OUT THE WEAK ONES: Selectivity independent of mode, passband tuning, ease of exalted carrier tuning, and notch filter all work together to give you the best possible signal under severe interference conditions. The synchrophase AM detector allows one to select the side band which has the least interference with the passband control. This makes exalted carrier tuning less needed under medium QRM conditions.

TUNING AND READOUT: The digital display is excellent. It "keeps up" with your band scanning very well (unlike my homebrew one which has too slow a sample rate) and was accurate as received. Zero beating with the aid of the RIT control (a fine tuning control) yields accuracy to the tune of 50 Hz and is accurate on all bands. The analog dial is good, but not up to the quality of the SPR-4. It is slightly sticky and lacks that smoothness that should be present in this price class. It is not especially accurate, but the digital readout makes it unnecessary to have a super linear analog dial.

POWER REQUIREMENTS: The R-7 runs off the usual AC line voltages and 12 VDC as well. Current draw on 12 volts is about 2.1 amps with normal volume settings. In comparison, the SPR-4/FS-4 draws 0.75 amps with special low current pilot lights in the FS-4.

SELECTIVITY OPTIONS: Standard equipment is the 2.3 kHz (1:1.8 shape factor) filter. Five other bandwidths are available from Drake: 6, 4, 1.8, 0.5 and 0.3 kHz. Sherwood offers a 3 kHz (1:1.8 shape) to fill the gap between 4 and 2.3 kHz filters. A total of 5 filters may be installed. If one desires a wide response (8-10 kHz) a 150 ohm resistor may be installed in place of a filter option. However, ultimate selectivity drops and spurious signals may be found.

OTHER OBSERVATIONS: Audio quality for SW is fine with the built-in speaker. Plenty of

volume is available. Changing bands may be slow to some owners, but it is much faster than the SPR-4/FS-4 which may require up to 5 knobs to be adjusted (3 on the FS-4 and 2 on the receiver). It is a pleasant change in not having to adjust any preselectors.

The usual audio output jack for a tape recorder or external amplifier is present, along with an audio input jack that can mix another audio source through the R-7's amplifier. This is probably of limited use to most SWL's.

The digital display can be used as a frequency counter up to 150 MHz. Input sensitivity is TTL compatible - if you don't know what that means, don't connect to this jack - it could be expensive!

CONCLUSIONS: This is easily the best set I have had the pleasure of owning. Such others as the SPR-4, R4-C, Heathkit SB303, Collins 75S-1, FRG-7 and the Questionable DX-300 will provide good reception under good to fair conditions, but in my opinion, only the R-7 will allow reception under conditions that would be intolerable with other receivers. BCB reception here is difficult under any conditions. I am hoping the addition of the Radio West Ferrite Loop Antenna will give the extra degree of preselection needed to prevent "spurious." A borrowed Space Magnet (SM-2) loop with the SPR-4 showed no signs of overloading.

I would be very interested in hearing from other R-7 owners, especially about MW reception in high signal density areas.

Mizuho AP-M1 MIZUHO AP-MI AUDIO PROCESSOR-USERS REVIEW

I recently purchased a Mizuho AP-MI Audio Processor from Gilfer Associates and am very pleased with it.

What this unit is, is a tunable, active filter which enhances the audio of a receiver by eliminating or reducing unwanted frequencies or bands of frequencies. I find that an active filter's most redeeming quality is in the reduction of noise. Active filters are advertised to improve receivers with poor selectivity, which is true, but they also help reduce noise in a better receiver with an inefficient automatic noise limiter (most of them).

I have built several active filters using 741 Operational Amplifier ICs and have had very good success with them. This unit employs four 741 op amps and a 386 audio amplifier. One of the features of this unit that most appealed to me was its small size and portability. It operates from a 9 V battery or an external 12 V power supply. I do a lot of my SWling/DXing on weekends while camping in my travel trailer. I use a Panasonic RF-2900 receiver for this, and this audio processor compliments the receiver very well. In fact, with my modifications the combination is better than the original. What I have done is to modify the receiver so that the MPx output jack is now a speaker input jack. I attach a cord from the AP-MI ext. sp. jack to this speaker input jack and am now using the receiver's speaker instead of the inefficient one in the AP-MI. If you wish to retain the MPx function you could add a jack someplace else. I don't use the MPx, so this arrangement is convenient. The patch cord can be made by cutting in half the long cable included with the Mizuho unit, which is too long anyway, and attaching miniature phone plugs to the cut ends. These can be purchased at any electronics store, but must be soldered on. You can also buy cables ready-made. These modifications do require electronic knowledge and experience; so don't try it yourself unless you have the qualifications.

I have also mounted the unit on top of the receiver, just above the digital readout, with stick-on magnets. This retains the receiver's portability. The processor employs both a band pass filter and notch function. I find the notch function of little value for SWling or DXing. It has limited use as a heterodyne eliminator, but the use of the band pass filter function makes the unit worth the \$49.50 (+1.50 shipping) price tag from Gilfer.

THIS AND THAT: MFJ Enterprises manufactures a number of accessories of use to DXers and they have published a new catalog, available free from MFJ Enterprises, Inc., P. O. Box 494, Mississippi State, MS 39762. They have preselectors, antenna tuners, filters for audio, active antennas, etc. Their products are often carried in ham supply outlets. (credit info. to ANARC DX Equipment Committee, The Market Place Report.)

Special pgms were also carried 5-7 May 0000-0430 on 11735 9620 7240: 0000 Spanish, 0030 Macedonian, 0100 Spanish, 0130 EG, 0200 FR, 0230 AR, 0300 SP, 0330 RS, 0400-0430 GM. Also 1000-1400 on 15240 11735 9620: 1000 SC (6 May only), 1100 EG, 1130 FR, 1200 AR, 1230 SP, 1300 RS, 1330 -1400 GM. These xmsns are in addition to regular ES, and will probably continue until after the funeral of Pres. ✓ ANTARCTICA LRA-36 R. Nacional Arcángel San Gabriel, at Esperanza Army Base in the Argentine Antarctic, plans on installing two 1500 watt xmtrs with the object of broadcasting on 3 different fqs in parallel; and the schedule will be increased from the present 0000-0200 on one 1200 watt xmtr on 6030. They QSL complete reception reports sent to them at Apartado 9411, 1000-C. Central, Argentina (Gastón Federico Rosenstrauch, Tortuguitas, Argentina, 17/4)

✓ BOTSWANA The US will soon begin construction of a new xmtr facility here, to carry pgms from both VOA and R. Botswana, 50 kW SW xmtr for VOA, 5 kW FM for R. Botswana (Ray Fronczak, MO, SCDX 22/4) VOA's 3rd stn on African continent will be here; no mention of location--Francistown? (Richard Ginbey, RSA, RN DXJB 8/5) It will be 50 kW on MW, 621 kHz at Selebi-Phikwe. R. Botswana will have use of it 0630-1830 local time, VOA 1830-0630. VOA pays most of the cost but gets the land free. USAID will train Botswanan engineers (Gaborone Daily News, 31/3, June REVIEW OF INTERNATIONAL BROADCASTING) Report of 1000 kW was in error (gh) EGYPT LN-10

✓ GABON RTVG nat'l svc reported from Libréville that the President had received the French Minister of Cooperation 2/5 and their discussion had centred on the forthcoming start of operations by the 'international radio stn' at Moyabi. Shortly after the audience with the President, the French and Gabonese ministers signed an agreement on the financing of the stn. During the past month irregular test xmsns of continuous mx without ammts have frequently been heard emanating from the xmtrs at Moyabi during the morning period variously on 21640, 17830 and 15265 (WBI 8/5)

✓ GRENADA On a visit to Grenada I learned that RFG plans to begin separate shortwave programming instead of MW relays, which should make things smoother. As of March 1980 they had run out of old R. Grenada QSL cards, and new RFG cards had not yet arrived; they appreciate reports and they are being held for verification when new cards arrive; IRCs are appreciated (Bill Schaap, Washington DC, June REVIEW OF INTERNATIONAL BROADCASTING)

✓ HAWAII In Honolulu, I checked on the KAIM plans. The CE said their SW plans have been permanently suspended and they have discussed selling the Maui land acquired for the site. They are continuing with 50-kW-MW-Molokai plans (Dave Walcutt, TX, June R.I.B.)

✓ HONG KONG As you might have gathered by now from the absence of xmsns on 3940, the service was a temporary one. It was mounted to provide a source of weather info for competitors in the China Sea Race from Hong Kong to Manila. There are no plans to activate SWBC and I am sorry to say that your next opportunity of receiving us will be in two years when I expect we will again be providing a similar service for yachtsmen (Ken Warburton, KTHK, 29/4 letter to Bob Hill, Redwood City CA) ISRAEL LN-10 (USA)

✓ JAMAICA I have spoken with the Director of JBC, Wycliff Bennett, who says there are plans for SWBC, held up by budget pressures (Bill Schaap, Washington DC, June R.I.B.)

✓ MOROCCO Per a JANA Libyan news agency report from Paris 30/4, France has decided to set up a radio stn in Morocco similar to that of Africa No. 1 in Gabon. The project to be carried out by the French state-owned company SOFIRAD. Quoting the French magazine 'Le Canard Enchaîné', the report added that the stn would broadcast in African langs and would function in collaboration with the African svc of REI (WBI 8/5)

✓ NIGERIA VON reported 22/4 that the FRCN would start broadcasting from the country's new capital, Abuja, from April 1982. The FRCN Director General also announced that a new xmtr costing over 14.4 million naira would be commissioned in August this year. He added that altho FRCN would move to Abuja, the external service VON would continue to transmit from Ikorodu (WBI 24/4)

✓ RAMADAN 1400 Per the Moslem calendar, the month of Ramadan (spelt Ramadhan, a.k.a. in Indonesia as Puasa) in the year 1400, will take place between 13/7/80 0650 GMT and 10/8/80 1908--the times are appropriate for Yogyakarta, Semarang and Magelang. Other places have to make their own conversion (DUDXS via IDXR) Means extended skeds on stns in Islamic world (gh)

✓ SOUTH AFRICA From Sept 1980 onwards R. RSA will use outofband fqs; I suppose they will move from 25790 to the 17605-17695 kHz range, to Eu 1700-1900 (Wolfgang Bdschel, May WDXC)

✓ UKOGBANI The BBC is negotiating to acquire a new SW transmitting site in the south of England. It will comprise 8 x 500 kW xmtrs (four ea. from Marconi and Telefunken) and is intended as part of a re-engineering scheme, to replace wartime 100 kW xmtrs, mainly located at Skelton in NW England. Skelton was chosen in 1942 for security reasons, but better propagation can be obtained from southern sites. The BBC claimed in 1950 that Skelton was then the

world's largest SWBC site with 12 x 100 kW and 6 x 50 kW xmtrs. In 1969 the 50 kW units were replaced by 6 x 250 kW at Skelton. The first of the new 500 kW xmtrs at the new site is expected on air in 1983 and the stn should be completed by the end of 1984 (Robert Jones, NSW, May ADXN) All the new xmtrs feature automatic program switching and automatic fq switching (World Radio Club via CMS Telegram 16/5)

✓ UNITED ARAB EMIRATES The UAE news agency (WAM) reported in an item carried by the Yugoslav news agency Tanjug on 30/4 that a 2-day meeting of radio pgm planners of the Arab Gulf countries ended in Abu Dhabi 29/4. A.G. info ministers had called for a study into the possibility of establishing a joint radio stn to broadcast foreign lang pgms to Bu & As. The meeting was attended by reps from Bahrein, Iraq, Kuwait, Oman, Qatar, Saudi Arabia and the UAE (WBI)

✓ U S A, The US is negotiating with EGYPT and ISRAEL for permission to build new xmtrs there or to use existing xmtrs to broadcast to the Soviet Union. Israeli facilities would aim at predominantly Christian areas of the USSR, while the Egyptian facilities would be used to reach Moslem ones. The House Foreign Affairs Committee, anticipating success in the negotiations, last week voted to provide \$12.7 million for these broadcasts, \$3 million for this fiscal year and \$9.7 million for the next one, which begins Oct. 1. The money would be used to buy equipment, hire staff and develop R. Liberty programming in the languages of Soviet Moslems. And the VOA hopes before yearend to start broadcasting in Azeri, the language of Soviet Azerbaijan (AP, Washington, Salt Lake City Deseret News 15/5 via Lamont Jensen) On 4/5 I heard a brief report on WINS that VOA is considering adding two more language services: Pushtu and Dari for Afghanistan. They noted that Persian is considered by some in Afghanistan as 'Oxford English' and therefore may not be understood by large groups of Afghans--Dari and Pushtu might reach more individuals (Beverly Slomka, Brooklyn NY) That's putting it mildly, per some editorials I've seen, accusing VOA of incompetence in not doing this long ago (gh)

AFRTS-Washington plans to close down and move to Los Angeles by Dec. 1, consolidating with AFRTS TV and transcription center. It is hoped that it will continue to operate on SW (gh)

CLANDESTINE CRANNY La Voz Oficial de las Fuerzas Especiales de Guerrillas Anti-Comunistas On 7/5 from 0600 GMT on, I heard a stn in SP on 6015--speeches by man alternating with talks by woman, and marimba mx. I got slogan and ID as 'La Voz Anti-Comunista, Radio Inacioné desde Nicaragua'. Super-polished and very tight pgms; never heard before. Good signal but a lot of QRM de VOA 6020 and another stn in Spanish on 6015 (Charles George, Dallas TX) 8/5 and *0842 on 6015, patriotic slogans, 'patria democrática', ID at 0915 as R. --- (two words) 'en Managua'. Many mentions of Nicaragua, bad audio with intermittent howls and buzzes, SIO 443 (Jack Jones, MS) I hrd this stn 9/5 around 0903 tuz in; could not get an ID but they did mention 'radio informaciones', program name. Henry Lazarus noted it IDing as in heading; after listening to tape, I hear the same thing (Chris Lobdell, Stoneham MA) I concur; they also use acronym FESGAC, or maybe without the C. Seems to be opposed to the current Nic. govt. Checked a few times for it, but haven't yet hrd it myself as of 25/5 (gh) more, LN-15

Cubans Up to 20 xmtr sites are now being used by the anti-Castro clandestines per a source close to the exile community. They use ham gear and transmit in a random fashion to make detection more difficult. The xmtrs are clustered in the three areas we have previously reported --Miami, Palm Beach County, and the upper Florida Keys. Most programs are pre-recorded. AP has reported that Ronald Reagan criticized the Carter administration for the alleged February closedown of an anti-Castro clandestine stn (John Santosuosso, May NNRC Alternative Radio)

R. Abdala with horribly distorted audio, 12/5 0320+ on 7075. Big-production pgm, M & W alternating commentary, into mx; freq and IDs in breaks, to 0333 tune-out (Jay Novello, Endwell NY) El Comandante David hrd 17/5 0115 on about 7083-85; usual anti-Castro spill (David Woodward, Washington DC) While looking for Com. David's usual broadcast, I heard a different (new?) clandestine Cuban, definitely not David's voice but maybe one of his cronies. At tune in on Sun 4/5 0115 on 7085, I caught the tail end of the Cuban national anthem, and s/off for one minute. Then back on with man announcing what sounded like 'Atención Cuba, éste es la voz de la patriótica cubana' /that's not correct Spanish; maybe patria -gh/. More statements in SP, into marching mx. Audio same general quality as R. Libertad Cubana and R. Abdala, namely, distorted. The male announcer then said they were broadcasting on '7400 kHz in the 41 mb', but nothing hrd there. This tape was played over and over till past 0135 when I tuned out. Can't be sure if it was pro- or anti-Castro; not hrd next two days in fruitless checks (Steve Reinstein, Miramar FL) Hrd the Cuban clandestine on 7400 again last night on 7400; name is 'La Voz de la --- --- Cubano'. I just can't get those two words--something like 'resistencia historia' /histórica? gh/ or similar. Weird signals: actual signal level steady while modulation varies from fuzzy to clear (Richard McVicar, Prescott, Ont., 8/5)

Numbers (cf May LN-8) I've once again heard R. Habana Cuba audio in the background of number xmns, with usual YL reading 5 digit numbers in Spanish, on 7884 14/4 at 0712; audio in parallel to 9525, not as fuzzy as before (Dave Mosier, CA) Re April LN on the 14985 kHz *2230-2240 numbers stn, I've heard it the past week strongly on 10570. Same format: one-second-interval beeps (too long for 'pips') prior to 2230, long beep, click and taped woman with English 3-digit groups. Nothing on 14985 (David Newkirk, Norridge IL, 20/4) Also here 2/5 2220 pips on 10570.0, 2229 mechanical YL giving 683-317-108 over and over; wonder why? (gh)

Hizbi i-Islami, Afghan rebel group, resumed xmns 26/4 with two 90-min xmns daily in Persian and Pashto, one in the morning, one in the evening, the Kuwaiti News Agency reported 27/4 quo-

ting press reports published in Islamabad, Pakistan. A similar report was also carried by the New China News Agency 27/4; no fq details were given (WBI 1/5) This may be an entirely different stn: (gh) A pro-Islamic stn broadcasting to Afghanistan and IDing 'Ishaa Allah' has been observed 1600-1655 on 15445 9730 (WRTH, WMR DX via May WDXC Contact) unID on 15064 hrd *1705-1800* 11/5 and 12/5, man speaking in very slow, distinct Farsi or Dari (the two langs are virtually identical); fair level but fluttery, about same quality signal as BSKSA 4 kHz lower. On 12/5 the xmsns was jammed, beginning a minute into the pgm, by a strong whining signal. I would guess this to be an anti-USSR broadcast beamed to Afghanistan in hopes of luring listeners tuning for Kabul on 15075 (Bob Hill, Redwood City CA) Eastern mx on 15064 at 1727, het BSKSA 15060. Maybe in Arabic; tough copy. Off 1759, SIO 232; Afghan SSR in on 15075, better (Jay Novello, Endwell NY, 12/5) This is R. Homeland, see IN-15!

Voice of Palestine, Voice of the Palestine Revolution continues to test on 1270 kHz; amnt 16/4 said they could be hrd daily 1500-1800 (WBI 24/4) On 25/4 VOPVOPR stn believed to be in Lebanon reported that the Angolan govt had granted the PLO office in Luanda the right to broadcast a radio pgm three times per week. A later report on 28/4 said the pgms would start 'the coming week' (WBI 8/5) Since the end of April amnts from the Lebanon VOPVOPR say the 0500-0700 xmsn is on 1143, while the evening 1500-1800 one is now on 1270 instead of 1143. Obs 6/5 show that tests are now being made on 1270 at 0500-0600; the use of 1143 for regular morning pgms is still continuing (WBI 8/5) Angola pgm anc'd 3/5 aq 2130-2200 3 times a week (WBI 15/5)

Voice of the Eritrea Revolution obs 22/4 with 1430-1500 Arabic, 1500-1520 Tigrigna on 6155 instead of 7245; normally on Sun/Tue/Thu, from R. Baghdad facilities (WBI 24/4)

Voice of Free Africa, hostile to Mozambican govt, was hrd on 4764 until 9/4; no xmsns have been obs since the 1830-1930 broadcast on that day (WBI 17/4) Anti-communist VOFA is off the air for a considerable time now; used to broadcast from Gwelo site in Rhodesia on MW 1020 in Portuguese with 100 kW. Following the Lancaster House agreements, VOFA went off the air, but returned shortly afterwards, claiming to operate from inside Mozambique. Before direction-finding could be undertaken to verify its claim, it went off the air again. If it indeed transmitted from Mozambican territory it was probably closed by the authorities. No reports to this effect have been received. This leaves only one clandestine anti-communist stn on the air in southern Africa, on 4950 beamed towards SWA/Namibia (QTH Africa 30/4)

Voice of the People of Burma Further obs on 7570 xmsn at 0030-0230 & 1130-1330 show the first half hour of each contains Burmese items only; the remaining sesquihour is made up of material in Karen, Jinghpaw, Shan, Wa and Standard Chinese--combat news, items hostile to the Burmese govt and army, and material critical of Soviet and Vietnamese policy in SEA. However, both xmsns failed to appear on 7570 at the above times on 27-29/4 (WBI 1/5) This stn which broadcasts on behalf of the Burma Communist Party remained off the air until 6/5 when it reappeared for its 1130-1330 xmsn on 7570; amnt in the 0030-0230 7/5 said it had been off the air from 27/4 'because of mechanical failure' (WBI 8/5)

China an unID Chinese-speaking cland is hrd occasionally at *1200-1230* with strident exhortations presumably hostile to the PRC govt. 26/4 it was on 5050s, next morning on 5988; a similar xmsn was hrd once in March closing 1430 on 7347; no ID possible yet (Bob Hill, CA)

European Music Radio received about 160 letters after saying in its March broadcast that it would close down unless listeners gave some indication of support. Its mailbox pgm 20/4 was quite something! 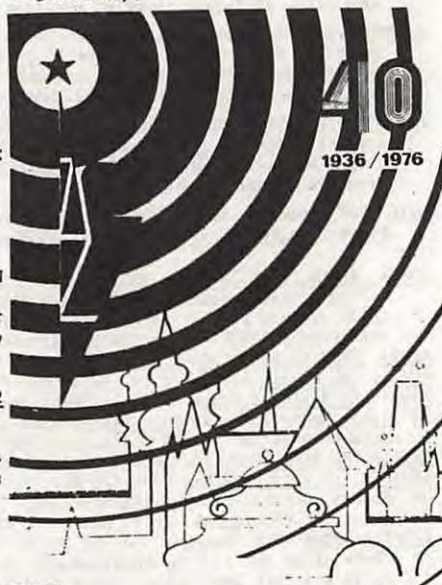

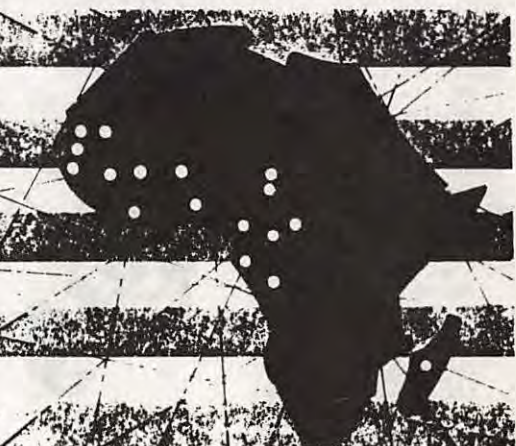
