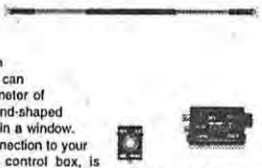

Computer based receivers have traditionally been about compromise, especially on shortwave. The Ten-Tec RX-320D broke that mold, providing exceptional HF performance. It employed true digital signal processing technology at the IF level to reduce the number of individual electronic components but yet provide features of far more expensive radios. The new RX-320D is capable of receiving DRM digital broadcasts with extra software (not supplied) and appropriate sound card. The Digital Radio Mondiale Consortium (DRM) was formed in 1998 when a group of pioneering broadcasters and manufacturers joined forces to create a universal, digital system for the AM broadcasting bands below 30 MHz. Since then, DRM has expanded into an international consortium of more than 70 broadcasters, manufacturers, network operators, research institutions, broadcasting unions and regulatory bodies. DRM is the world's only nonproprietary, digital system for shortwave, AM and LW providing near-FM quality sound. This new D model has a 12 kHz I-F output jack on the back panel that allows received signals to be streamed from the I-F directly to your computer's sound card for Digital Radio Mondiale decoding. This special decoding software is only available (for 60 Euros, about \$60.00) through the DRM consortium via the DRM Software Radio web site located at www.drmtx.org. It is not available through Ten-Tec or Universal Radio. As with the original DX-320; you can enjoy selecting any five filters from 34 built into the radio (25 choices from 1050-8000 Hz and 9 from 300-900 Hz, all with 1.5:1 shape factor or better). A spectrum display function is also supported. Memories store frequency, mode, filter, BFO, name, comments, notes. A local-time, world-time (UTC) clock is continuously displayed. This stand-alone, black box PC radio only requires access to a serial port and one megabyte of free hard drive space for the software. It runs either Windows 95/98 or Windows NT. As with most Windows programs you can launch the PC radio, tune to an interesting station, and then put it in the background while your PC performs other tasks. You can even surf the web and tune the world at the same time. The line output can drive a computer sound card plus there is an external speaker jack (speaker not supplied). The RX-320 features a telescopic antenna or there is an RCA type antenna jack for an external antenna (recommended). With informative owner's manual written by noted author Joe Carr. Mark Byford, Director, BBC World Service and Global News delivered the keynote address. The conference looked at audiences, global branding, partnerships, technology, media asset management, digital platforms, production systems, a detailed analysis of content and business models, plus rights and regulation. The final session of the conference focused on public diplomacy, war and the media.

In a few months, the **European DX Council** will hold its annual conference in Konigstein, Germany with DXers and radio station personnel from all over Europe and abroad expected to attend. Similar to the recently held Winter SWL Festival, the EDXC Conference will focus on the upcoming digital changes being made for shortwave transmission and reception. Here's a reminder that the 15th edition of the *Australasian Shortwave Guide* (ASWG) with over 1400 entries, covering the international shortwave transmission period of 30 March 2003 through 25 October 2003 is still available. The ASWG is a detailed and accurate listing available in 36 pages, A5 format, saddle stitched. It provides comprehensive information of English shortwave schedules to Australia, Asia, the Far East, the Indian sub-continent, and the Pacific, and for broadcasts in all languages to Australia and the Pacific. The data is arranged in two sections, by studio country and starting time. Each entry shows broadcasting organization, frequency, starting time, finishing time, language, target area, transmitter site, transmitter country, studio country, and days of operation. The new schedules of Digital Radio Mondiale (DRM) transmissions are included, as well as late breaking international broadcasting news. The ASWG is available for A\$10.00 to Australian addresses. For airmail delivery outside of Australia, US\$10.00/Euro 10 (or 10 International Reply Coupons). Payment may be in cash (Australian dollars, American dollars, Euros, or the equivalent in any other currency), Australian personal check, Australian bank

check, Australian Money Order, International Money Order, International Bank Draft, Australian Credit Union check, Australian Building Society Check, or Australian mint stamps. All checks and orders must be payable in Australian currency, drawn on Australian banks, and payable to "Bob Padula". Payment can also be made via credit card using PayPal, using the E-mail link to bobpadula@bigpond.com. Easy Listening

Welcome to Easy Listening!

It's been quite a while since I provided any overview of what the *Easy Listening* column in the *Journal* is all about. Since I suspect there has been an uptick in membership with Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF), I figure there might be some NASWA newcomers in our midst.

Many of the NASWA columns are geared to the "sport fishing" aspect of shortwave listening—DXing. I liken DXing to sport fishing in that the "thrill is in the chase", since many DX targets aren't English language broadcasts, nor are these stations particularly easy to hear. Once we know which station we've "caught", we'll listen long enough to be able to prove we heard it—in order to request a QSL. Some folks don't DX for QSLs, of course—some do so for indignant music that isn't otherwise listenable.

By comparison, the *Easy Listening* column focuses on the programming content available from shortwave broadcasters. The column focuses on those broadcasters that are comparatively easy to hear via shortwave—hence, the title *Easy Listening*. Since this column focuses on the message, the medium—shortwave—is less relevant in the discussion. Information on the various media strategies broadcasters use is mentioned here if it makes it easier for a listener to hear a particular broadcast. Every once in a while I'll include information from a broadcaster that doesn't use shortwave, such as the BBC's Radio Four, or the CBC's domestic Radio One service, if the program is likely to be of interest to an international audience, and if the program is available via webcast, if not via shortwave.

For the most part, the column focuses on English language programming; the exception is music programming, if music occupies a significant portion of a broadcast

schedule. After all, music can be appreciated in any language.

Member comments aren't invited—they're encouraged! Finding out what types of programming members are interested in helps me prioritize the subject matter of each month's column. My contact information appears each month at the top of the first page of the column, as well as on the back cover of the *Journal*.

Speaking of OIF

As I write this, the intensity of media coverage on Iraq has lessened somewhat, though the BBC schedule hasn't entirely returned to normal. Which international broadcasters were the most useful during the war?

The **BBC World Service** went to non-stop news as soon as the conflict started; its coverage was thorough, and thoughtful, as one would expect given the BBC's reputation for news, and recent interest in being known primarily as a news source. There was emphasis on the war itself, less so on peripheral issues. The BBC has modified its schedule somewhat, with non-news programming filling out the second half-hour of many hours of programming, but music and dramatic features haven't yet returned to the schedule.

Radio Australia altered its schedule slightly, and I found its coverage to be especially valuable because Radio Australia's news analysis programming—originating primarily from the domestic Radio National service—didn't emphasize live news as it happened. Instead, the news analysis programming took a more analytical, distanced view of the action. The domestic evening newsmagazine, *PM*, airs on shortwave at 0800 UT and is comparatively easy to hear in North America. The program is also available

on-demand at Australia's ABC website (<http://www.abc.net.au/pm>) and, in slightly higher bandwidth, at the World Radio Network website (<http://www.wrn.org>, click on Listeners' Area, then Radio Australia, then the 0800 webcast). With the combat phase in OIF largely behind us, you will likely hear more domestic Australian content. As of the column's presstime, Australia's ABC had a special website set up where all their content focusing on Iraq could be launched from a single starting point. See <http://www.abc.net.au/rn/crisis.htm>.

Deutsche Welle took a more skeptical view of events in Iraq, given Germany's opposition to the war. Their programming—especially *Newslink*, the current affairs program, took a longer view of the war, its consequences, and its aftermath. *Newslink* aired in the first half hour of each hour's broadcast, and was still reasonably easy to hear in North America via shortwave. More on that in a minute.

Radio Netherlands did their usual fine job in each edition of *Newsline*; their schedule was not significantly altered due to the war, providing a bit of a haven from the wall-to-wall coverage provided elsewhere.

Interestingly, one tended to see a more pro-American perspective on US cable TV news channels than was offered even at the **Voice of America**, which took a balanced position.

Is shortwave still relevant in times of crisis?

Roger Broadbent, the host of Radio Australia's *Feedback* program, posted an interesting question at the Feedback website to solicit user comments: "Is Shortwave radio still relevant in times of crisis?" Two responses were particularly well thought out. First, from Paul Kidd on the island of Tonga:

...Clearly the Australians, the British, and the Americans each have different "world views" and national interests. That sometimes results in a different perspective

on news events. Since we listen to all of these various news sources on shortwave radio, we are able to "synthesize" what we hear reported, and that enables us to get a broader understanding of "what's happening" in the world at large. This would not be possible if we only had access to a single source of news and information. As I said, we have no television here. Some would say that we are therefore "deprived", or that we are "missing something". In some sense, that is true: we don't see the images of world events, and therefore we do miss some of the "immediacy" of modern-day news reporting. Even though we are certainly missing the "entertainment" provided by TV, I am not at all convinced that we are missing much of any real value in terms of information. Television news reporting, naturally, relies heavily on imagery to "inform" the audience, but imagery alone is not the "story".

A visually dramatic image can be, and often is, an inadequate substitute for real substance in news reporting. We may be "captivated" by a TV image, but we are not necessarily well-informed. Radio news, on the other hand, relies entirely on the spoken word to convey information. For the radio audience, the process of listening to the news is a form of active involvement, as opposed to the passive activity of staring at the tube, and being "fed" the news.

Secondly, from Roger Chambers, of Utica, New York:

On a more personal level, from someone with broad band internet access, short wave is still vitally important to hearing "news and views" from a variety of perspectives from around the world.

From shortwave broadcasts, from before the war through the beginning of the Battle of Baghdad, I have heard the following:

- *About 20 bipartisan former US Senators wrote a letter in late February to President Bush, seriously questioning the apparent change in US policy to include preemptive strikes of another nation. (Radio Havana Cuba)*

- A US diplomat to Greece resigned in protest of the impending war, writing a very thoughtful resignation letter with his reasons. (heard originally on Radio Havana Cuba, the letter found a few days later on the NY Times Web site).
- The resignation of a second US diplomat based in Georgetown, with prior service in London, Moscow, and Belgrade, for the same reason of being strongly opposed to the war policy of the Bush Administration (heard on Spanish National Radio (REE), and on the Voice of the Islamic Republic of Iran (VOIRI).
- Throughout the first 10 days or so of the war, protests around the world continued, including 50,000–100,000 in Cairo for three days running. Many demonstrations across Australia, and the population of Australia are very split on the war. (Radio Australia, among many others stations).
- Radio Netherlands provided an in depth look at the various views of Iraqi exiles living in the Netherlands.
- The Voice of Turkey has had much news exploring Turkey's pivotal role. Turkey, whose population is about 90% opposed to the war, is caught between the Moslem world, satisfying commitments to the US and NATO, and fear of offending Germany and France who could stall their application to join the European Union.
- Radio Prague has covered the ambivalence of the Czech people about the war, even though about 200 Czech forces, largely experts in chemical weapons, have been deployed to Kuwait.
- Radio Budapest, Hungary, reported on a site used within Hungary for military training of former Iraqi exiles by the US. Hungarian residents of the area are nervous about this.
- Radio New Zealand broadcast an extensive interview which culminated with this view: "The International Community" does not like to be bullied, and will make the US pay

the price, if only to give it some humility for the next time around."

Much of this information has not been widely reported by the American based media.

Thanks to Roger Broadbent and John Figliozzi for sharing these. These are excellent examples of the perspectives one can glean from shortwave radio that aren't available elsewhere. By the way, Radio Australia's **Feedback** airs via shortwave Saturday 0600 and Sunday 0300 UT. On-demand archives aren't generally available, but Roger says they're in the works.

Deutsche Welle can still be heard here

Despite the fact that **Deutsche Welle** chose not to target North America (and Australasia) via shortwave as of the A-03 schedule change in late March, Deutsche Welle can be heard in eastern North America without too much trouble, though the time of day isn't convenient. John Figliozzi and I noted the following frequencies as being reasonably reliable in the northeastern USA:

0400 UTC: 7225 kHz (OK), 11945 kHz (good quality)
 1900 UTC: 13590 kHz (good quality)
 2100 UTC: 11865 kHz (good quality), 15205 kHz (very good quality).

There may be other audible broadcasts in your location—please let me know, and I can pass the information along to others. Most **Deutsche Welle** programs have at least the most recent edition of each program available for on-demand download, and Deutsche Welle also has a round-the-clock English language webcast. See <http://www.dw-world.de/english>, then click on "DW-Radio | Live".

BBC World Service Schedule? Who knows?

If the **BBC World Service** gets around to restoring their regular schedule, you'll notice some changes. Repeat editions of

programs aren't spread around the week as was previously the case; most editions of non-news programs air with a 24-hour time block. The information I received directly from Audience Relations differs slightly from what was published in the April *BBC On Air*, but here are some highlights:

Radio Japan: Less news

I truly wish I could like **Radio Japan**, because I'd love to know more about the world's second-largest economy, its culture, and its issues. Unfortunately, **Radio Japan** tends not to dig too deeply into the

economic and cultural issues facing the nation. The programming is certainly more interesting than the infamous recitation of mundane (and inflated) economic statistics on Eastern European stations while the Warsaw Pact was in force, but I wish Radio Japan challenged Japanese icons and issues a bit more thoroughly.

The most significant schedule change for Radio Japan for the A-03 time period is the shortened length of its newscast from 15 minutes to 10 minutes; a new 5-minute music program, *Songs for Everyone*, follows the weekday newscasts in the 1100 broadcast, and the Tuesday-Saturday newscasts in the 0000 broadcast. Another new music program, *Japan Musicscape*, airs in the 1100 broadcast on Wednesdays.

Non-shortwave suggestion for the month

If the BBC is slow to restore a varied service, you can still listen to excellent BBC science programming via the web: **Radio 4's** website shows 11 different science programs available for on-demand (or live) listening at its website, <http://www.bbc.co.uk/radio4/science/>. I listened to a particularly interesting edition of *Frontiers* dealing with the Human Genome Project, with the full half-hour of the program dealing with a single subject in depth. If you'd rather listen live, *Frontiers* airs Wednesdays 2000 UTC.

DX Target: Radio Okapi A Fondation Hirondelle Project Enabling the People of the Congo to Communicate

A new shortwave broadcast station began operations in February 2002 from the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC). Called Radio Okapi, the station is a joint project in the DRC by the United Nations Organization Mission in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (MONUC) and the Fondation Hirondelle, located in Switzerland. This DX Target will focus on the DRC, the Fondation Hirondelle (or Hirondelle Foundation) and, of course, the station, Radio Okapi.

The Country

The Democratic Republic of the Congo, located in central Africa, is one of the largest countries on the continent. French is the official language. Years of civil war and corruption have badly damaged the country's infrastructure. The DRC shares its borders with Angola, Zambia, Burundi, Sudan, Rwanda, Tanzania, the Central African Republic and the Republic of

the Congo. The country's capital city is Kinshasa. Other important cities include Lubumbashi, Mbuji-Mayi and Kisangani. An international port is situated at Matadi on the Zaire River.

The DRC has one of the richest reserves of natural resources in the world. Although the country should benefit as a result of this fact, this is not the case. Together with economic mismanagement, the on-going conflict in the country has resulted in the economic decline of the DRC. The war has meant a decrease in national production in all industry sectors. The war in the DRC has claimed over a million lives. The conflict is by no means a clean-cut case of civil war, it is one of a multi-national character involving seven nations.

Formerly, the Belgian Congo, this territory was inhabited by ancient Negrito peoples (Pygmies), who were pushed into the mountains by Bantu and Nilotic invaders. The American correspondent Henry M. Stanley navigated the Congo River in 1877 and opened the interior to exploration. Commissioned by King Leopold II of Belgium, Stanley made treaties with native chiefs that enabled the king to obtain personal title to the territory at the Berlin Conference of 1885.

Brussels granted freedom to the former colony on 30 June 1960. The Katanga Province seceded from the new republic on July 11 beginning many years of national civil strife. In one form or another unstable governments and revolution since independence have besieged the former Belgian Congo.



Since 1997 the Democratic Republic of the Congo, formerly called Zaire, has experienced ethnic strife and civil war, touched off by a massive inflow in 1994 of refugees from the fighting in Rwanda and Burundi. The government of former president Mobutu Sese Seko was toppled by a rebellion led by Laurent Kabila in May 1997. His regime was subsequently challenged by a Rwanda and Uganda-backed rebellion in August 1998. Troops from Zimbabwe, Angola, Namibia, Chad, and Sudan intervened to support the Kinshasa regime. The DRC, Zimbabwe, Angola, Uganda, Namibia, and Rwanda signed a cease-fire on 10 July 1999 with Congolese armed rebel groups. Nevertheless, sporadic fighting has continued. Kabila was assassinated on 16 January 2001 and his son Joseph was named head of state on 26 January 2001. Despite taking a radically different approach than his father, the new president has been equally unsuccessful in ending the war.

The Hironnelle Foundation

The Hironnelle Foundation is an organization of journalists, which sets up and operates media services in crisis areas. It is the only organization in the world, which has such specialized experience in this field. As a result of its activities, a number of interesting radio stations appeared around the world. Unfortunately, many of these stations have had very short broadcasting lives.

Since its founding in 1995, Hironnelle has established and managed Radio Agatashya in the Great Lakes region of Africa, Star Radio in Liberia, the Hironnelle News Agency at the International Criminal Tribunal for Rwanda at Arusha in Tanzania, Radio Blue Sky in Kosovo, Radio Ndeke Luka in Bangui in the Central African Republic, and Moris Hamutuk, a radio program for refugees in Timor. Its latest venture is Radio Okapi in the Democratic Republic of Congo.

The Foundation strongly believes that an independent media has a fundamental role to play in societies where authoritarian and non-democratic regimes are in power. In such situations, the traditional media tend to fall silent because of insecurity and physical risks. The Hironnelle Foundation collaborates in the development of tolerant and democratic societies and contributes to creating a responsible, civic-minded exchange of opinions within the public.

The following governments finance the projects of the Hironnelle Foundation: Switzerland, the European Community, the United States, the Netherlands, Sweden, Great Britain, France, Canada, Germany and Japan. International organizations involved include the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees, United Nations Educational Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO), the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC), the International Foundation for Electoral Systems and the United Nations Development Program (UNDP). The Hironnelle Foundation falls under Swiss law.

One of the Hironnelle Foundation's cardinal rules is independence from political and economic influences. Independence can guarantee the impartiality of the Foundation's journalistic activities and ensure credibility to its audiences. The Foundation aims to create or support independent media. The staff of the Foundation comes from all nationalities and cultures.

The Foundation works to establish an independent media under the most difficult circumstances in authoritarian and non-democratic societies. The Fondation Hironnelle is usually active where conflict is endemic, where there are open hostilities or in post-conflict regions. It is also present in situations where the political, economic or social conditions are not as inviting for an independent media. Obviously, the Democratic Republic of the Congo is well suited for the media and communications expertise the Hironnelle Foundation offers.

The Station

Radio Okapi is named after a peaceful, four-legged mammal that lives mainly in the Democratic Republic of the Congo, and is a protected species. It has no known enemies. The okapi is well liked by the people of the DRC. Over the years, it has lent its name to various Congolese businesses. No political or military force has tried to appropriate the okapi's name in the past. The MONUC's station is the first such use of the okapi name.



Radio Okapi is the largest radio project that the United Nations and the Fondation Hirondelle have ever conducted. It is a radio operation enabling the people of the Congo to communicate with their compatriots. It is a radio station intended to work hand-in-hand with the peace process. Radio Okapi is a network of radio stations designed to cover this immense country of 2.4 million square kilometers, providing services for approximately 45 million inhabitants. The network center is in the capital, Kinshasa. There are six regional studios with plans for four other regional studios to be located in four political and military hotspots. The network is served by satellite, shortwave and FM transmitters and by the Internet.

Radio Okapi is a service aimed at a population suffering from years of military conflict and economic stagnation resulting in almost one million refugees and over two million displaced people. Three million people rely on daily food programs while about 300 thousand people are treated for malnutrition. The school attendance rate tumbled to 43% in 1999 from 70% in 1993. Programs are designed to contain non-partisan, credible information broadcast throughout the country. Programs are devoted to themes relating to health, education, human rights, culture and music. The first year's budget is nearly US\$2 million. This should be less in succeeding years once the initial start up costs have been made. The operation will be run by around 100 journalists, presenters and staff, the majority of whom will be Congolese.

The project involves close co-operation between the United Nations and the Hirondelle Foundation with the aim of making a lasting contribution to peace in the Democratic Republic of the Congo. It also involves co-operation with the existing media in the DRC, mainly with other radios in the fields of production and training. The project is a network of stations designed to continue into the post-MONUC phase.

Programs

Radio Okapi offers programs, which include news bulletins, magazines and music to everybody in the DRC, whether they are the parties to the conflict or the international community. All broadcasts fall under the authority of the MONUC, the United Nations Observer Mission in the Democratic Republic of the Congo. Radio Okapi broadcasts those programs that are prepared under the supervision of the Hirondelle Foundation.

Apart from news, these broadcasts focus on such topics as humanitarian aid with the main goal being the promotion of a peaceful solution to the conflict in the DRC. The programs produced by Radio Okapi are distributed free of charge to local radio under an agreement specifying the terms and conditions of their use and their rebroadcast.

Radio Okapi pays particular attention to the situation of the victims of the violence and war, refugees, displaced persons and those who are destitute and especially vulnerable. In its information and magazine programs, Radio Okapi provides specific information on the activities of the United Nations and its specialized agencies, as well as about the MONUC mission, its priorities, the problems it is facing and the peace process. Radio Okapi provides detailed coverage to the process of dialogue among the various political and military groups in the DRC.

The programs are produced and broadcast mainly in French, Lingala, Swahili, but also in Chiluba and in other local languages as well as English for members of the

international community. Radio Okapi provides local, regional and international news. It produces magazines and interviews done on the spot.

Broadcasting and Production Facilities

The capital, Kinshasa, the headquarters of MONUC, has a central studio coordinating the national program. The shortwave broadcasting system based in Kinshasa covers the entire country. Each regional studio receives the program from Kinshasa and broadcasts it locally. A medium-powered FM transmitter adapted to the




local topography provides FM quality reception in its area. The main program is also broadcast via the Internet and the latest news as well as specific programs are available on the Internet.

In February 2002, the first morning programs on Radio Okapi commenced on FM in Kinshasa and on shortwave, consisting of one to two hours a day of news broadcasts and magazine features. The station's head of technical services, Georges Schleger, says the station broadcasts on shortwave using 6030 kHz, 9550 kHz and 11690 kHz with a 10-kilowatt transmitter using a Marconi exciter and amplifier. The antenna is a yagi three element pointed to the east 80 degrees from Kinshasa. The 11690 kHz outlet has competition from Radio Africa International in French from 0600 to 0800 UTC so a listener needs to be careful logging Radio Okapi.

Several governments have shown an interest in the Radio Okapi project and have been asked to contribute over the long term to the financing of the operation. Three countries contributed to cover the budget for the first year: Great Britain, Switzerland and the United States.

The station appears that it will be an excellent verifier of listener reception reports. Electronic reports can be sent direct to . Through this route I have heard from Dominique Jaccard, Desk Officer in a speedy 4 minutes and 33 seconds and from Georges Schleger/VE2EK, Communications Officer, Head of Technical Services Radio Okapi, MONUC in only one day. A postal report will take a little longer and is answered with a nice QSL card. Written reception reports with return postage can be sent to:

Test transmissions from a temporary site: Radio Australia Gngangara

Without prior notice, quite suddenly and unexpectedly, test broadcasts on behalf of Radio Australia were heard from a new location early in the year 1975. This is what happened.

In an endeavor to gain improved coverage into Asia, a beautiful new transmitter base was constructed for Radio Australia on Cox Peninsula, across the bay from Darwin in the Northern Territory. Three transmitters at 250 kw were installed and five log periodic antennas.

Test broadcasts from this new facility began in December 1968, and regular programming with all three transmitters in use began in March 1970. These three transmitters were given feed-line callsigns, VLK, VLL and VLM.

However, on Christmas Eve 1974, the worst cyclone in Australian history struck Darwin, destroying 80% of the city, though fortunately the death toll was quite low considering the circumstances. The large modern transmitter station near Darwin was seriously damaged by Cyclone Tracy and it was evident that it would be off the air for a long period of time.

A temporary new station was urgently needed and site investigations in Western Australia ultimately led to the quick installation for a new facility located near Carnarvon on the central coast. Preliminary test transmissions to assess the feasibility of the projected new station were conducted from another location, Gngangara, just north of the state capital Perth.

The Gngangara facility was previously in use as an OTC station which had been erected for the purpose of shortwave communica-

tion with a satellite tracking station on the island of Mauritius. There were three transmitters at 7.5 kw and several rhombic antennas at Gngangara.

Thus it was that unexpected test transmissions were noted from Gngangara, using two of the low powered communication transmitters in parallel, feeding into directional rhombic antennas. The program tapes were prepared in the Melbourne studios of Radio Australia and consisted of the familiar melody, "Waltzing Matilda," long segments of recorded music, and test announcements in English.

These test broadcasts commenced on February 25, 1975 and concluded two weeks later on March 10. The schedule shows that seven different channels were in use during these two weeks of test broadcasts, ranging from the 31 metre band up to the 16 metre band. They were beamed towards Indonesia, South Africa and England.

This short series of test transmissions from Gngangara was considered to be a success, and they demonstrated that signal propagation into the desired target areas would be adequate from Western Australia. Government approval was therefore granted for the erection of a new though temporary shortwave station at Carnarvon, further north in Western Australia.

A few QSL cards were issued by Radio Australia for these test broadcasts, though they must be quite rare these days. It was just 28 years ago next Tuesday that these test broadcasts from Gngangara on behalf of Radio Australia were suddenly and unexpectedly heard on the shortwave bands.

CLANDESTINE—MIDEAST *The Voice of Mujahidin of the People* which spreads programs from Iraq towards Iran has it seems stopped emitting. See BELOW. Seemingly freed now the Iranian jammer to increase jamming against VoA Radio Farda transmissions instead. (wb/BC-DX/Bueschel-DE)

The Iranians have been jamming *Radio Farda* much more for some days now. They are using jammers of the "pouring water" type that normally are used against the Mojahed freq jumpers. Are the Mojahed transmitters active, or have they been silenced by the war? (Olle Alm-SWE, BC-DX Mar 26/Bueschel-DE)

The "pouring water" or "chop-chop" jamming of Farda is of the same type that is used on 11575, and a slightly offset carrier is heard. Daytime, 21575 seems not to be jammed—if it is I can't hear it. Similarly, 13680 seemed to be clear of it this morning, but I hear jamming at 1530 but no Farda signal! Jamming seems to be selective at times or maybe it is just haphazard? 17675 and 15290 were both audibly jammed this morning. Perhaps the renewed intensity has to do with events in the country to the west of Iran?

I haven't heard the Clandestine Mojahed stn either—or should I say the jamming. This was an absolute "Pain" in the 9300-9390 range and made freq selection difficult. Presumably the transmitters were in the central/southern part of Iraq and have had a visit from a flying object? (Noel R. Green-UK, BC-DX Mar 26/Bueschel-DE)

Heard the same buzzing sounds I used to hear from Baghdad Radio on this frequency...can you hear anything on this freq? (Tarek Zeidan SU1TZ, EGY, BC-DX Mar 30)

Yes, I hear always a BUBBLE jammer during dark hours, like Iranian type. Bubble jamming the whole

day on 5860 kHz against Farda from Kavalla-GRC.

MEDIA BEHAVIOR ROUND-UP 1600 GMT 17 APR 03

AUS newspaper has reported that the USA is sponsoring a new AM radio station in Iraq called the "*Voice of the New Iraq*." The new radio station marked the birth of the "Iraq Media Network," which would eventually include newspapers and TV stations run by returning Iraqi exiles, the report added.

Voice of the Liberation of Iraq, a station believed to have hitherto been operated jointly by var-

ious Iraqi opposition groups in Sulaymaniyah, has been monitored on a mediumwave frequency formerly used by Republic of Iraq Radio's Kurdish service, and is also reported to be broadcasting on FM in Baghdad and Kirkuk.

The US/UK airborne TV service *Towards Freedom* and the UK-run *Radio Nahrain* near Basra are also presumed to be on the air. *US Information Radio* continues to be heard by BBC Monitoring.

The following is a round-up of BBC Monitoring's media observations on Iraq and related reports for the 24-hour period up to 1600 gmt on 17 April:

New broadcasts reported inside Iraq The US newspaper Wall Street Journal on 16 April reported that the USA was sponsoring a new radio station in Iraq called the "*Voice of the New Iraq*," featuring a mix of pop music and promotional ads. The new radio station marked the birth of the "Iraq Media Network," which would eventually include newspapers and TV stations run by returning Iraqi exiles, the report added.

The Wall Street Journal report stated: "Beamed nationwide from a new 20-kilowatt transmitter in the port city of Umm Qasr, the US-sponsored "*Voice of the New Iraq*" went on air for the first time Tuesday [15 April] with a mix of pop music and promotional ads...The new radio station at Umm Qasr marks the birth of the US taxpayer-funded Iraq Media Network, which US officials say will soon include a nationwide TV channel and an independent newspaper, all run by previously exiled Iraqis along with journalists recruited from within the country..."

"IMN, as it is already known, is the handiwork of the Indigenous Media Project, an offshoot of the Pentagon's Office of Reconstruction and Humanitarian Assistance, run by retired Lt-Gen Jay Garner...The network's technicians have deployed to the Baghdad International Airport to set up mobile TV transmission gear...Project director Robert Reilly used to run Voice of America, but has been in Kuwait for weeks to set up the network...An IMN newspaper and TV station could be months away..."

Voice of the Liberation of Iraq was monitored in Arbil on 17 April from 1000-1700 local time [0700-1400 gmt] on 657 kHz mediumwave (a frequency formerly used by Republic of Iraq Radio's Kurdish service). According to reports which BBC Monitoring cannot confirm, the Voice of the Liberation of Iraq has hitherto been operated jointly by various Iraqi opposition groups in Sulaymaniyah. The station has not in the past announced any contact information or given any direct indication of its political affiliation.

Voice of the Liberation of Iraq was also reported on 17 April to be broadcasting on 88.8 MHz FM for Baghdad, and 89.5 MHz FM for Kirkuk. BBC Mon-

itoring has so far not been able to confirm these FM broadcasts.

US-run Information Radio

During the reporting period US-run Information Radio has continued to be heard at various times on shortwave 4500 and 9715 kHz shortwave and 756 kHz.

FORMER IRAQI SERVICES

Iraq Satellite Channel has not been observed since 1618 gmt on 7 April. Colour bars have been observed on the channel's satellite frequencies since 1024 gmt on 9 April. Arabsat has been reported as saying it will not resume Iraqi TV transmission without Arab League authorization.

Republic of Iraq Television: No video or audio from the main domestic TV channel has been observed by BBC Monitoring. Youth [Shebab] TV has not been reported on the air since shortly after the start of air attacks on Baghdad. No news sources have reported any Iraqi TV services on the air in Baghdad.

Republic of Iraq Radio Main Service was untraced by BBC Monitoring on its usual frequencies in the reporting period. No news sources have reported any Iraqi radio services on the air in Baghdad.

Voice of Youth radio, operated by Uday Saddam Husayn, was last heard by BBC Monitoring at 0430 gmt on 25 March.

BROADCASTS TARGETING IRAQ

Voice of the Iraqi People picture bulletin 2359-0059 15 April 03 The Voice of the Iraqi Republic, the Voice of the Iraqi People has been broadcasting against the Iraqi regime since January 1991. The radio station had been heard before the fall of Saddam Husayn carrying appeals to the Iraqi people and army to rebel against the his regime. (BBC Monitoring research 17 Apr 03/DX Listening Digest/Hausser-OK) DXLD)

Google. It never ceases to amaze us what can be done with this search tool. In the search field, enter a NA telephone number without punctuation. For listed numbers, you get a name or names, address, and links to Yahoo and Mapquest maps. The "feature" appears to be limited to NA; experiments with variations on other countries' numbers and country-specific servers failed.

Listening note. I have a Yaesu tri-band VX5R handheld transceiver on a short magnet-mount whip antenna on the car roof. With the recent summer seasonal frequency change, I've been enjoying Moscow's music programs on 11675 while driving home in the afternoon. No surprise there, but on April 15 I had to go to Atlantic City after work. I left the transceiver on. After Moscow left the air Iran on 11670 was loud and clear on apparently its new summer frequency.
