**BRAZIL** R. Cultura da Bahia, 9590, at 0100 in PP, daily(Zilmer)

**CANADA** CHNX now back on 6130, noted 1834(John Moritz) By letter dated 8/21/75 over signature of Axel Thogerson, RCI anncs termination of RCSWC. Reason given is, essentially, that RCI no longer needs technical reception data from listeners.(RCI, via Al Niblack.)

**CHILE** R.Nac.de Chile, 6195, \*1000. No LV de Chile pr or mention of it. (Zilmer)

**CHINA** V.Malayan Rev., 1303 Malay, diff lang at 1308, fair till covered by ute.(Hauser)

**CYPRUS** Mention on RCI FF DX pr that at abt 1950 BBC EMR relays CBC Forces pr on 3989.(") CUBA RHC on 11835 QRMing Haiti & Uruguay at 2358, or is this a ghost in my SK190? (Earhart) It's no ghost:(DF) 11870, NF ex 11855, 2113 VoVietnam pr. (Hauser)

**COLOMBIA** Re my rpt in FS, Believe I said 5980 was not //6030. Believe only there a week or so. Mexico now there.(Jack Jones) 5990 possible SS ID for LV de Centavo, 0915-1000 when NHK s/on. Unable to catch QTH due bad QRM. (Zilmer)

**ECUADOR** HCJB 15265, 1240 interrupting pr 9/2 for relayed rpt on coup attempt, from 2 blocks from the Plaza Grande, Quito. (Hauser) HCJB has new 25 yr contract w/EC govt. (Insinger)

**EGYPT** Cairo at 0155 in Arabic on new 9625(Jaar)

**GREENLAND** Godthaab s/on 1013 on 9575 after weak IS, good to 1110 when R.Australia s/on 5980. (Jaar) Victor, I assume fgy for Godthaab s/b 5975. ? (DF)

**GUAM** TWR address is TWR, Box 3518, Agana, Guam (96910. Ed Insinger)

**GALAPAGOS** LV de Galapagos, 4810, 0403-0454 SS, talk, prayer, s/off.(Henry Lazarus)

**GUINEA-BISSAU** Richard Ginbey rpts in SCDX dated 8/12/75 that RN de Rep de G-B has moved to new 6240 1830-2300+. However, McCoy hrd it on 5040 at 0624 on 8/27, Lazarus hrd it on 5040 at 0635-0735, 8/31, and Jaar hears daily\*0600-0800+ & 2150-0000\* on 5041. Hence, 6240 bears checks to see if a second tx in use there.(DF)

Still confident this is Simalungan contrary to official sked from stn; noted 1500 w/Jakarta mx. Pematang Siantar mentioned in ID....2324 RPKD Cianjar Gammelán, mx 1430...5046 RRI Yogyakarta singing & lessons in Indonesian at 0815, s/off 0830; then s/on 1000.(Tyson) RRI Sorong at 1138-1200, strong & readable.(Lineback) Fgy?(DF)

**JAPAN** FEN Tokyo, EE pops 0725. Not often hrd due BBC cochannel(Tyson)

**N.KOREA** Pyongyang, 9340, 1100-1150\* lang; also on 9420 at 1000-1050\* & 1200-1300+ in EE; at 1000 is //11535. (Zilmer)

**S. KOREA** V.of Hope, 6348, 1045-1115 lang(Zilmer)1138-1200\* Korean(Bill Whitacre) 9600, new fgy for R. Korea, \*1100-1130\* EE nx, lang 1130, //9640. (Zilmer) SS 1130 on 9640, annc another fgy(maybe in 19 mb)(Jaar)

**KUWAIT** RK, 11940 EE at 1734, news, pops, letterbag, till 1835 t/o(McCoy)

**LAOS** 6130, tentative at 1143 in Asian lang.; 1200 R.Moscow QRM.(Whitacre)

**LEBANON** R.Lebanon, AA 0215, EE 0230, news & jazz.(Hadley Cress) 9675 kHz.

**MALAGASY REP** R.Ned., 21480, 1410 DX pr(Cress) 9585, R.N., EE nx 2000(Cress)

**MAURITANIA** RNM, 0704-0731 AA, good-fair(Moritz) 0711 guitar mx, nx(McCoy)

**MEXICO** RM, 0127 on 5980 kHz to Caribbean, in SS w/ID(McCoy)

**MOZAMBIQUE** 9618.3, Can Phumo(or whatever) definitely 8/30 as audio in Luso PP mentioning Lourenço Marques, not sure of context.(Hauser)

**MUSCAT** Muscat has anncd test bestds: 0500-0815 on 6174, 1300-1700 on 11890, 0600-0815 and 1400-1600 on 4886. However, Caversham hrd the last xmsn actually on 4962 kHz. (BBC WRC 8/20 via Hauser) I believe this would be a new SWBC country. (Hauser) Don Jensen?

**PAKISTAN** RP, 17820 at 1535-1545\*(Cress) 7085 at 2100 w/EE nx, weak(Insinger) On 9460 at \*1300 EE nx, comment, mx(Zilmer)

**PAFUA** R. Milne Bay, tentative, 1209 Pidgin w/Polynesian & CW mx(McCoy)

**PERU** R. Samarón, Iquitos, on 4815 at 0500\*, "LV de la Revolución(Peruana)"(Jaar)..nxt pge

 because of summer sked. 6060 also hrd during evening & night hours w/ mx & It nx, also  
 EE, FF & GG, as described in WRTH.(Jaar)  
SEYCHELLES FEBA, 0137 Hindi news on 15270. (Tyson-Australia)  
SIERRA LEONE SLBC, 5980, 0555-0631 EE(Lazarus) 0694 EE, BBC nx, covered by KGEI s/on at  
 0700.(McCoy) Well hrd w/EE & local dialects after 0630, BBC nx 0700. Also often heard  
 at s/off 2330 on 3316 w/ EE anmts & anthem. (Jaar)  
SRI LANKA Colombo w/ EE to Eur on 15120 at 1915. 9720 & 11800 unhrd due QRM(Jaar) SLBS  
 in lang at 1503 w/ subcontinental mx; noisy, on 11800(McCoy)  
S.AFRICA ZUO time sig stn 0414 w/ MCW IDS(Hauser) SABC hrd on 3980 past the 2200  
 mentioned in the update to EE/NA list. Still going 2340. Anyone have a sked?(Earhart)  
SOLOMON ISLANDS SIL&BS 1045 w/mx, EE nx 1100, 1119\* on 5020(Zilmer) 1100-1116\* w/ EE nx  
 local closing anmt & off w/GSTQ.(Lineback)  
SOMALIA 9585.7 Very likely Mogadishu, via long path, het against R.Japan at 1415(Hauser)  
SINGAPORE Tentatively hrd on 6155 in Malay, TC on  $\frac{1}{2}$  hour.(Whitacre) Time?(DF)  
UGANDA has new 250 kw xmtr since 7/28 on 6030, 1400-1430 FF, 1430-1500 EE, 1500-1530  
 in Swahili, according to R.Australia DX pr(Hadley Cress)  
USSR...In reply to my report of April 30, 1975, I received the following cryptic message  
 from Radio Baku, Azerbaidjan SSR, USSR: "The frequency pointed in your letter dos'n't  
 (their spelling) accord the frequency of Radio Baku"...I reported for 9840 kHz. Accordingly

VIETNAM, N. Tay Bac, 6450, 1120 lang, talk & mx, poor(Zilmer)  
YEMEN ARAB REP. Sanaa now back on old 5804 kHz at 0300 s/on; no longer on 9585.(Jaar)

41 METER COORDINATED MONITORING EVENT The CME was not set up as a contest, and will  
 not be treated as such. However, some did ask for a tabulation of total stations heard  
 by each participant, and this tabulation has been made. The definition was altered  
 slightly, with the word station taken to mean (for CME purposes only:) a transmitter  
 site on a given frequency. Thus, for the purposes of the CME, the BBC on two different  
 frequencies counts as two "stations". With that understanding, the results were as  
 follows: Ed Shaw 111, Doug Snyder 87, Gerry Dexter 72, R.C. Van Wyckhouse 70,  
 Glenn Hauser 66, Don MacKay 61, David Snyder 40, Al Mayer 39, Henry Michalenka 35,

 Sam Barto & group had 26 "stations". Sam had several fellows over for the event, and

 FRENEX, as well. (Dan Ferguson)
